

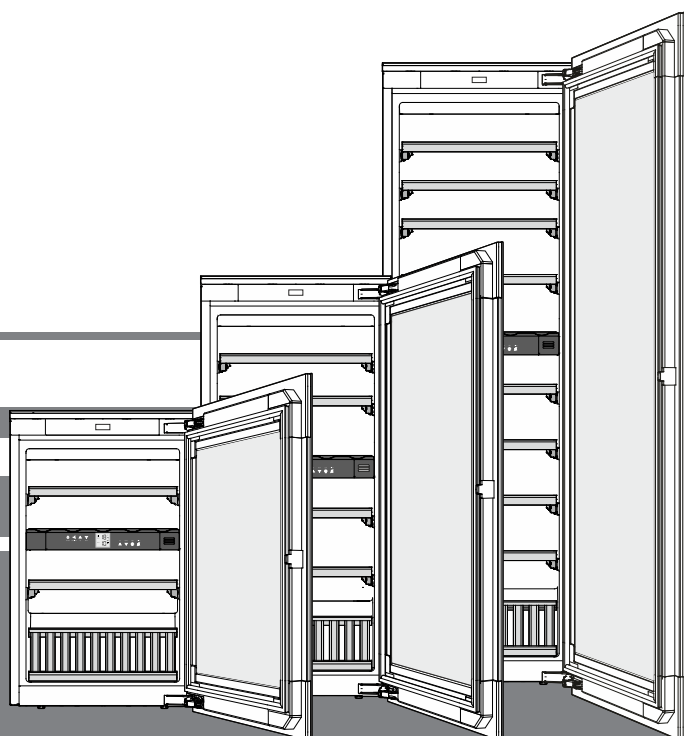

## Priority of warnings




 <b>DANGER</b>	identifies a situation involving direct danger which, if not obviated, may result in death or severe bodily injury.
 <b>WARNING</b>	identifies a dangerous situation which, if not obviated, may result in death or severe bodily injury.
 <b>CAUTION</b>	identifies a dangerous situation which, if not obviated, may result in minor or medium bodily injury.
<b>NOTICE</b>	identifies a dangerous situation which, if not obviated, may result in damage to property.
<b>Note</b>	identifies useful information and tips.

## Safety instructions and warnings

- **WARNING:** do not seal ventilation openings on the appliance housing or enclosure.
- **WARNING:** only use the mechanical devices or other aids recommended by the manufacturer to help speed up the defrosting process.
- **WARNING:** do not damage the refrigerant circuit.
- **WARNING:** do not use any electrical devices in the refrigerator compartment which do not comply with the design recommended by the manufacturer.
- **WARNING:** the mains cable must not be damaged while installing the appliance.
- **WARNING:** multi-sockets or distributor strips and other electronic devices (such as halogen transformers) must not be positioned and operated at the rear of appliances.
- **WARNING:** danger of injury through electric shock. There are live parts under the cover. Only have the interior LED light replaced or repaired by customer service staff or trained personnel.
- **WARNING:** risk of injury from the LED lamp. The light intensity of the LED light complies with laser class RG 2. If the cover is defective, do not look directly at the light through optical lenses from close distance. This may damage your eyes.
- **WARNING:** this appliance must be secured as described in the operating instructions (Installation instructions) to rule out any potential risks due to its instability.
- This appliance may be used by children aged 8 and over and by people with reduced physical, sensory or mental abilities or a lack of experience and expertise if they are supervised or have been instructed on the safe use of the appliance and have understood the risks associated with it. Children must not be allowed to play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance must not be carried out by children without supervision. Children aged 3 or over and 8 or younger may load and unload the refrigerator/freezer.

- Do not store any explosive substances, such as aerosol containers with flammable propellant gas, inside the appliance.
- To prevent injury and damage to property, the appliance should only be installed by two people.
- After unpacking it, check the appliance for signs of damage. Contact the supplier if it is damaged. Do not connect the appliance to the mains power supply.
- Avoid prolonged skin contact with cold surfaces (e.g. chilled/frozen products). If necessary, take safety action (e.g. gloves).
- All repairs and work on the appliance may only be carried out by customer service personnel or other trained personnel. The same applies to changing the mains power cable.
- Only carry out repair and other work on the appliance when the mains plug has visibly been disconnected.
- Only install, connect and dispose of the appliance as described in these operating instructions.
- In the event of a fault, pull out the plug or switch off the fuse.
- When disconnecting the appliance from the mains, pull on the plug. Do not pull on the cable.
- If you have a lockable appliance, do not keep the key near the appliance or within reach of children.
- The appliance is designed for use in enclosed areas. Do not operate the appliance outdoors or in areas where it is exposed to splash water or damp conditions.
- Do not use the interior LED light to light the room. The interior LED light is only designed to illuminate the interior of the appliance.
- Do not allow naked flames or ignition sources to enter the appliance.
- Alcoholic drinks or other vessels containing alcohol should be sealed tightly for storage.

## Symbols on the appliance

	The symbol can be located on the compressor. It refers to the oil in the compressor and indicates the following danger: swallowing or inhaling can be fatal. This is only relevant for recycling. There is no danger in normal operation.
	Warning about inflammable substances.
	A sticker to this effect may be applied to the rear of the appliance. It refers to the foampadded panels in the door and/or the housing. This is only relevant for recycling. Do not remove the sticker.

## EPREL database

As from 1 March 2021, information about energy labelling and ecodesign requirements will be available in the European product database (EPREL). You can access the product database using the following link: <https://eprel.ec.europa.eu/>. You will be asked to enter the model identifier. You will find the model identifier on the type plate.

## Range of appliance use

The appliance is suitable solely for storing wine in a domestic environment or similar. This includes, for example, use

- in staff kitchenettes, bed and breakfast establishments,
- by guests in cottages, hotels, motels and other forms of accommodation,
- in catering and similar services in the wholesale trade.

Use the appliance solely as is customary within a domestic environment. All other types of use are inadmissible.

The appliance is not suitable for storing and cooling medicines, blood plasma, laboratory preparations or similar substances and products covered by the 2007/47/EC Medical Devices Directive. Any misuse of the appliance may result in damage to or spoilage of stored goods.

Furthermore, the appliance is not suitable for operation in potentially explosive atmospheres.

## Disposal notes

The appliance contains reusable materials and should be disposed of properly - not simply with unsorted household refuse. Appliances which are no longer needed must be disposed of in a professional and appropriate way, in accordance with the current local regulations and laws.



When disposing of the appliance, ensure that the refrigerant circuit is not damaged to prevent uncontrolled escape of the refrigerant it contains (data on type plate) and oil.

- Disable the appliance.
- Pull out the mains plug.
- Cut through the connection cable.

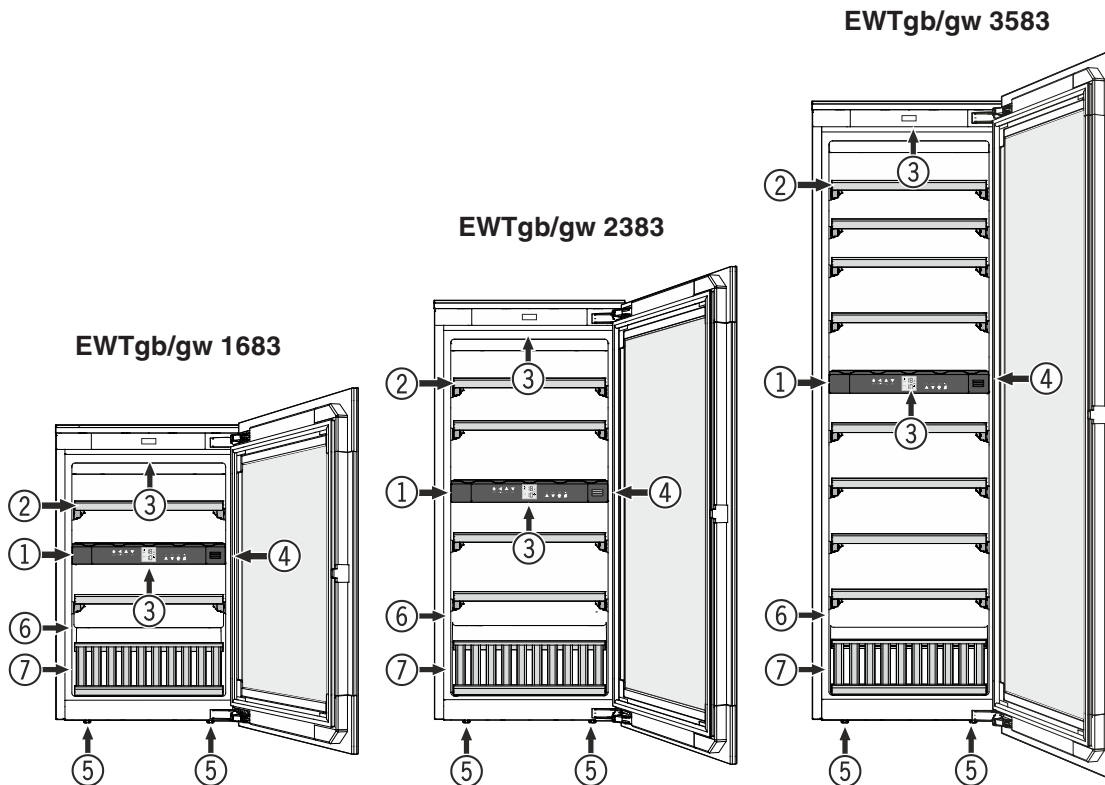

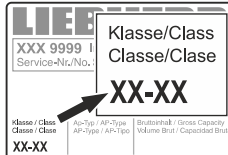

## Climate rating

The climate rating indicates the room temperature at which the appliance may be operated in order to achieve full refrigeration performance.

The climate rating is indicated on the type plate.

The position of the type plate is shown in the section entitled **Description of the appliance**.



Climate rating	Room temperature
SN	+10°C to +32°C
N	+16°C to +32°C
ST	+16°C to +38°C
T	+16°C to +43°C
SN-ST	+10°C to +38°C
SN-T	+10°C to +43°C

**Do not operate the appliance outside the specified room temperature range.**

## Setting up

- Avoid positioning the appliance in direct sunlight or near cookers, radiators and similar sources of heat.
- Standard EN 378 specifies that the room in which you install your appliance must have a volume of 1 m<sup>3</sup> per 8 g of R 600a refrigerant used in the appliance, so as to avoid the formation of inflammable gas/air mixtures in the room where the appliance is located in the event of a leak in the refrigerant circuit. The quantity of refrigerant used in your appliance is indicated on the type plate on the inside of the appliance.

## Electrical connection

Only operate the appliance with **alternating current (AC)**.

The permissible voltage and frequency are indicated on the type plate. The position of the type plate is shown in the section entitled **Description of the appliance**.

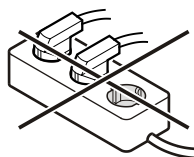
The socket must be properly earthed and protected by a fuse.

The tripping current of the fuse must be between 10 A and 16 A.

**The socket must not be situated behind the appliance and must be easily accessible.**

Do not connect the appliance using an extension cable or extension socket.

Do not use stand-alone inverters (conversion of direct current to alternating/three-phase current) or energy-saving plugs. Risk of damage to the electronic control system!

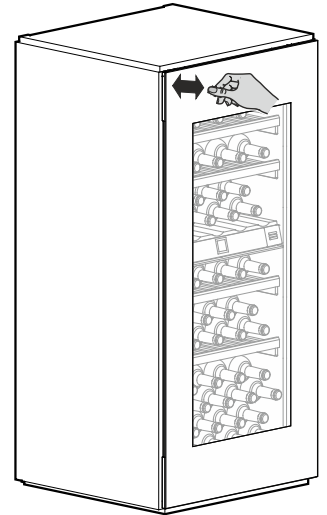


## Door opening mechanism

The appliance is equipped with a door opening mechanism.

### Opening the door

Push the door slightly inwards on the top left-hand side and release again.

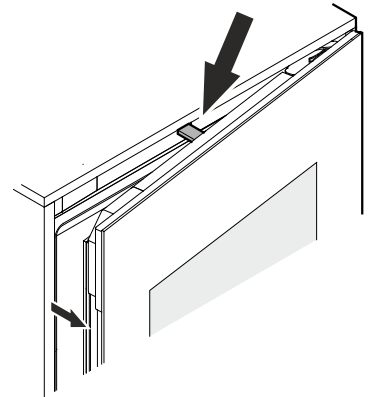


The door is opened approx. 7 cm by the push rod.

The door can then be fully opened.

### Note

The door will close again automatically after approx. 3 seconds if it has not been fully opened.



## Important notes

**Do not operate the appliance near magnetic fields or place magnetic objects near the appliance.**

**The door may otherwise open when you do not want it to.**

**Do not block the door or hold on to it while it is opening.**

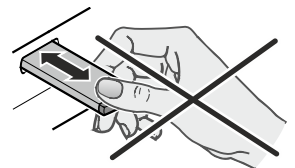
If the door is blocked or held open during opening, the internal safety coupling will be activated.

**Loud, repeated cracking noises will be heard.**

**Do not push the push rod in or hold on to it during closing.**

If the push rod is blocked during closing, it will no longer be able to reach its initial position.

In the initial position, the push rod is flush with the front of the appliance.




**Setting the push rod back in its initial position**

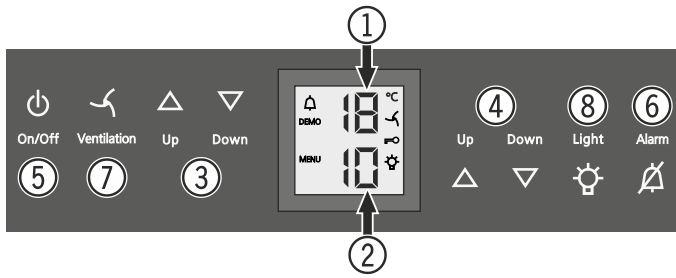
**Disconnect the appliance from the mains, wait for approx. 5 seconds and plug it back in again.**

The push rod returns to its initial position.

## Operating and control elements





The electronic control panel has the new "touch capacitance technology". Any function can be activated by touching the corresponding icon.

The exact contact point is between the symbol and its label  On/Off



- (1) Upper compartment temperature display
- (2) Lower compartment temperature display
- (3) Upper compartment temperature setting buttons
- (4) Lower compartment temperature setting buttons
- (5) On/Off button (switching the appliance on and off)
- (6) Audible warning On/Off button
- (7) Fan switch
- (8) Interior light On/Off button

### Symbols in the display

-  Alarm (symbol flashes if the temperature inside the appliance is too high or too low)
- DEMO** Demo mode is activated
- MENU** Setup mode is activated (activating the child lock and adjusting the display brightness)
-  The interior fan runs constantly
-  Child lock is activated
-  The interior light is switched on constantly

## Switching the appliance on and off

### Switching the appliance on

Press the **On/Off** button until the temperature display lights up.

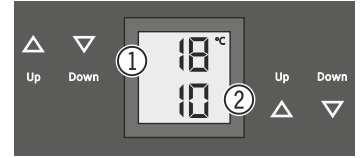
### Switching the appliance off

Keep the **On/Off** button pressed for approx. 3 seconds so that the temperature display goes out.



## Setting the temperature

The temperature of both compartments can be set separately.



- (1) Upper compartment
- (2) Lower compartment

### Reducing the temperature

Press the **Down** button.

### Increasing the temperature

Press the **Up** button.

- When pressing one of the buttons for the first time, the display will start to flash.
- Pressing this button again enables you to change the temperature setting.
- The electronic control system will switch over automatically about 5 seconds after the last time you pressed the button, and the actual temperature will be displayed.

The temperature can be set at between +5°C and +20°C.

The following drinking temperatures are recommended for the various types of wine.

Red wines: **+14°C to +20°C**

Rosé wines: **+10°C to +12°C**

White wines: **+8°C to +12°C**

Sparkling wines, Prosecco: **+7°C to +9°C**

Champagne: **+5°C to +7°C**

If you are storing wine for long periods of time, it should be stored at a temperature of between +10°C and +12°C.

## Fan

The interior fan ensures a constant and even interior temperature and a suitable climate for wine storage.

The humidity in the appliance can be increased even further by activating the **Ventilation** button. This has a particularly positive effect for long-term storage.



**Ventilation**

The increased level of humidity prevents the corks from drying out.

## Door open alarm

If the door is left open for more than 60 seconds, the audible warning signal will sound.

If the door must be opened for a lengthy period to place items into the appliance, cancel the audible warning signal by pressing the **Alarm** button.

**Alarm**



The alarm switches back to standby when the door is shut.

## Temperature alarm

If the temperatures in the interior are out of the permitted range, the audible warning signal will sound and the temperature display will flash.

- Cancel the audible warning signal by pressing the **Alarm** button.

After a lengthy power failure, the temperature in the interior may have risen to too high a level. After the power supply returns, the fall in temperature can be watched on the display.

The temperature display will stop flashing as soon as the temperature in the interior has reached the set value.

### Temperature alarm after a fault in the appliance

If the appliance develops a fault, the temperature in the interior may rise too high or fall too low. The audible warning signal will sound and the temperature display will flash.

- Cancel the audible warning signal by pressing the **Alarm** button.

If the temperature displayed is too high (warm), first check whether the door is closed correctly.

If the temperature display continues to show a value that is too high or too low after one hour, contact the customer service department.



If **F1**, **F8**, **E1**, **E2**, **E7** or **E8** appears in the display, the appliance has suffered a fault.



In this case, contact the customer service department.




## Set-up mode



In set-up mode, you can set the child lock and adjust the brightness of the display. The child lock is designed to protect the appliance from being switched off and the temperature setting from being changed accidentally.



### Adjusting the display brightness

Use buttons **Up** and **Down** to select the desired setting.

**h0** = display lighting off

**h1** = minimum brightness

**h5** = maximum brightness

The adjusted brightness will be activated after one minute.

#### Note

If a button is pressed, the display lights up for one minute at maximum brightness.

When commissioning the appliance, the adjusted brightness will only be active once the set interior temperature of the appliance has been reached.

## Interior light

The interior of the appliance is lit by an LED light strip at the top of each compartment.

The interior light will always switch on when the appliance door is opened. The interior light will go out approx. 5 seconds after the door is closed.

Press the **Light** button if you want the interior light to be on even when the door is closed.

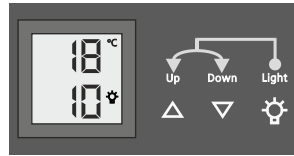


### Note

This function applies to the lighting of both compartments.

Furthermore, the brightness of the lighting can be adjusted.

- Press the **Light** button.
- Press and hold the **Light** button and at the same time press the temperature setting buttons to increase or decrease the brightness.

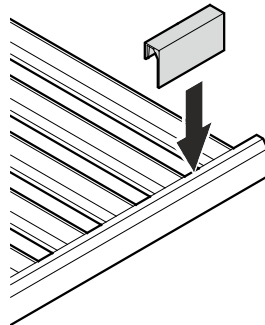

Additional labels can be obtained from your dealer.

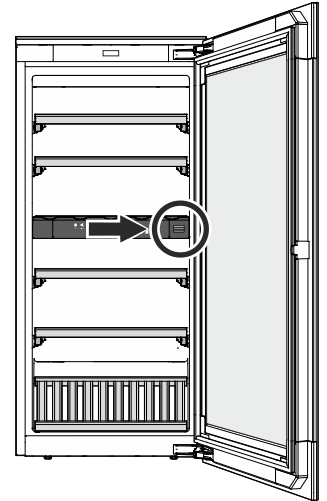


## Air exchange with activated charcoal filter

The way in which wines continue to mature depends on the ambient conditions.

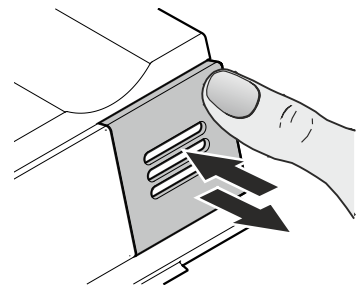
The quality of the air is therefore decisive for preserving the wine.

We recommend that you replace the illustrated filter once a year. Filters can be obtained from your dealer.

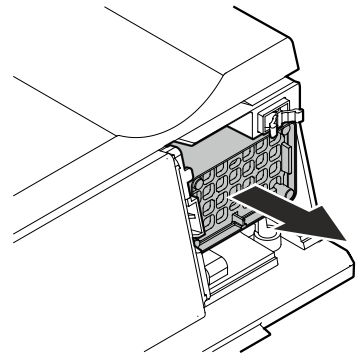


## Changing the filter

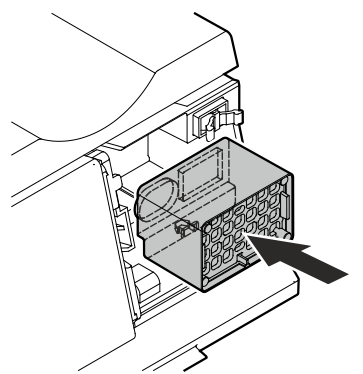
- Push the cover in and release it again.



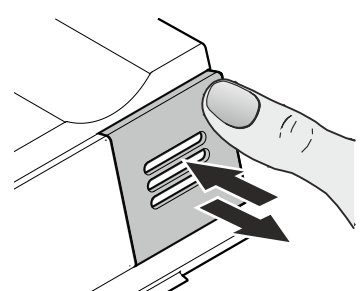
- Pull out the filter.



- Insert the filter



- Insert the cover, push it in as far as it will go and then release it again. The cover is automatically locked into place. You will hear a click.

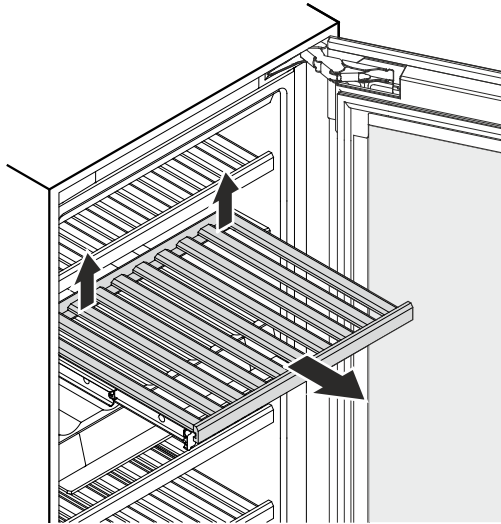




## Removing and inserting the wooden shelves

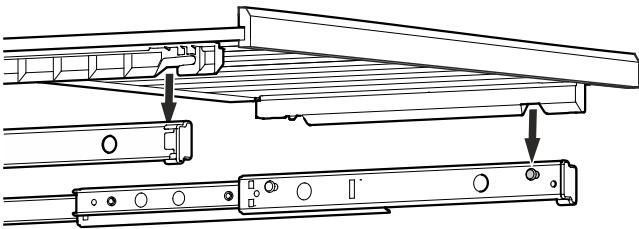
The wooden shelves can be removed for easier cleaning of the inside of the appliance.

### Removing the wooden shelf



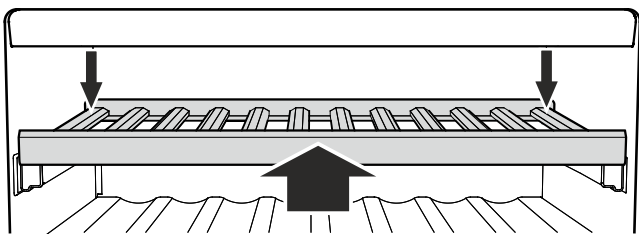
Pull the wooden shelf upwards on the right and left at the back (release) and then remove it towards you.

### Inserting the wooden shelf



Extend the pull-out rails as far as they will go. Place the front recesses of the wooden shelf on the securing pins.

Slide the wooden shelf together with the pull-out rails into the appliance as far as they will go.



Push the wooden shelf right to the back so that it clicks into place at the front.

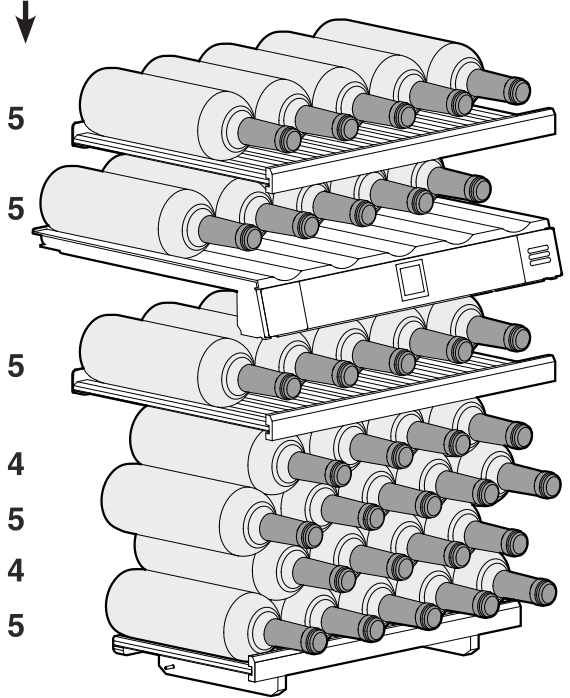
Push the wooden shelf downwards on the right and left at the back and click into place.

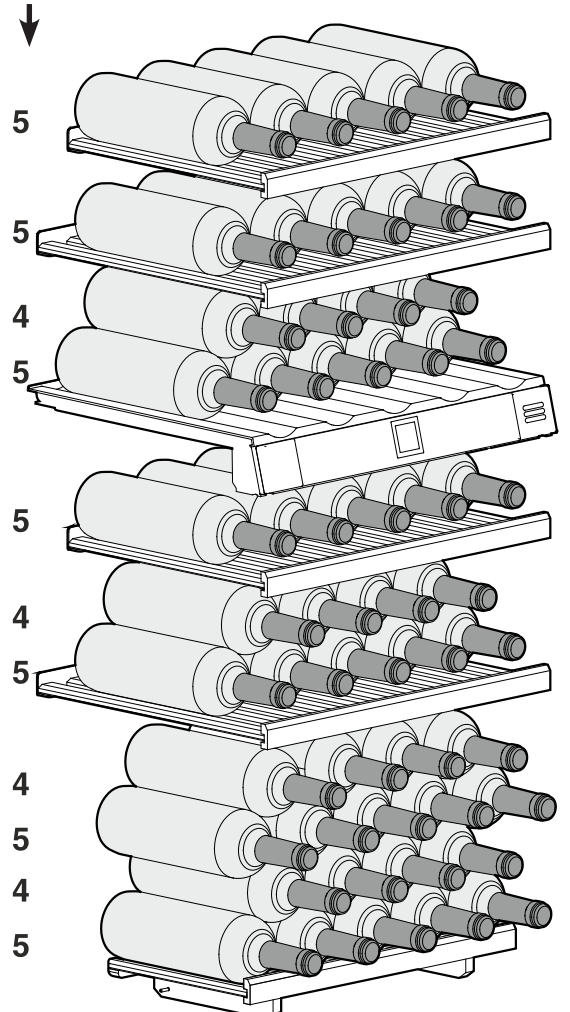

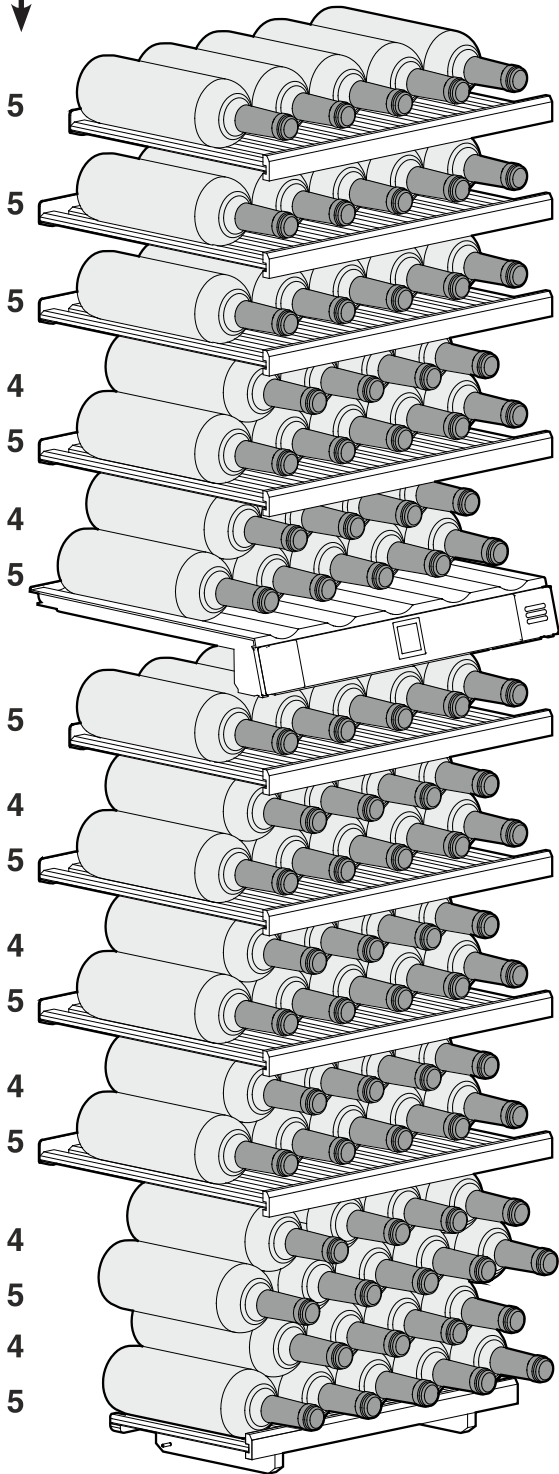

## Cleaning

A failure to follow these instructions may result in the food being spoilt.

### ⚠ WARNING

Before cleaning, always disconnect the appliance from the mains. Pull out the plug or switch off the fuse.

Surfaces which may come into contact with food and accessible drain systems must be cleaned at regular intervals.

If the door is left open for a lengthy period, the temperature in the appliance's compartments may rise dramatically.

- Clean the inside, equipment parts and outer walls with lukewarm water and a little detergent. Do not use chemical solvents or any cleaning agents containing sand or acid.
- Use a glass cleaner to clean the glass surfaces and a commercially available stainless-steel cleaning agent for the stainless-steel surfaces.

### ⚠ CAUTION

Risk of damage to the appliance components and risk of injury due to hot steam.

Do not use steam cleaning equipment to clean the appliance.

- Ensure that no cleaning water penetrates into the electrical components or ventilation grille.
- Dry all parts well with a cloth.
- Do not damage or remove the type plate on the inside of the appliance. It is very important for servicing purposes.

If the appliance is left empty for a lengthy period, it must be switched off, defrosted, cleaned and dried and the door is to be left open to prevent mould formation.

## Malfunctions

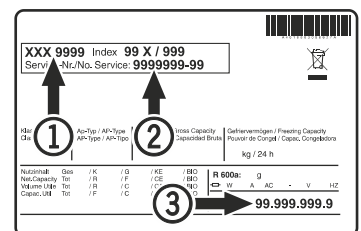
- **F0, F1, E1, E2, E7 or E8 appears in the display.**
  - The appliance has suffered a fault. Contact the customer service department.
- **The fans inside the appliance are running although the fan function has been deactivated and the compressor (refrigeration unit) is idle.**
  - This is a normal operating state depending on the set interior temperature and ambient temperature at the place of installation.

**You may be able to rectify the following faults by checking the possible causes yourself.**

- **Appliance does not function:**
  - Is the appliance switched on?
  - Is the plug correctly fitted in the mains socket?
  - Is the fuse intact?
- **When inserting the mains plug, the refrigeration unit does not switch on, but a value is shown in the temperature display.**
  - Demo mode is activated. Contact the customer service department.

- **Loud running noise:**
  - Is the appliance set up firmly on the floor?
  - Does the appliance cause nearby items of furniture or objects to vibrate? Please note that noises caused by the refrigerant circuit cannot be avoided.
  - Due to the various speed steps, speed-regulated compressors can generate different running noises. The sound is normal.
- **The temperature is not low enough:**
  - Is the temperature setting correct (see "Setting the temperature")?
  - Does the separately installed thermometer show the correct reading?
  - Is the ventilation system working properly?
  - Is the appliance set up too close to a heat source?
- **The compressor runs for a long time.**
  - The compressor switches to a low speed when little cold is needed. Although the running time is increased as a result, energy is saved. This is normal in energy-saving models.
- **A low hum.**
  - The sound is produced by air flow noise of the fan. The sound is normal.
- **The internal light does not come on.**
  - The appliance is not switched on. Switch the appliance on.
  - The door was open for longer than 15 minutes. The internal light switches itself off automatically after about 15 minutes if the door is open.
  - The LED illumination is faulty or the cover is damaged.

If none of the above causes apply and you cannot rectify the fault yourself, contact the nearest customer service department stating the type designation (1), service number (2) and appliance number (3) as indicated on the type plate.



The position of the type plate is shown in the section entitled **Description of the appliance**.

## Shutting your appliance down

If your appliance is to be shut down for any length of time, switch it off and disconnect the plug or switch off or unscrew the fuse.

Clean the appliance and leave the door open in order to prevent unpleasant smells.

The appliance complies with the relevant safety regulations and EU Directives 2014/35/EU, 2014/30/EU, 2009/125/EG and 2011/65/EU.



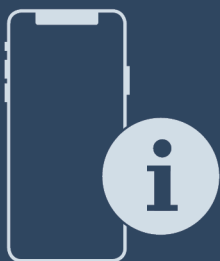



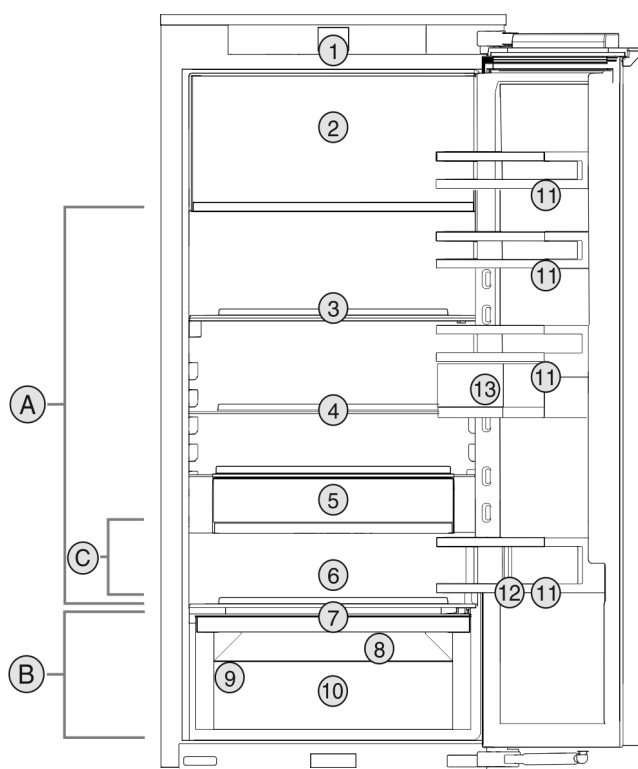


Fig. 1 Example illustration

#### Note

▶ Shelves, drawers and baskets are arranged for optimum energy efficiency when the appliance is delivered. Changing how the shelves, for example, are inserted in the fridge compartment does not have any impact on energy consumption.

### 1.3 SmartDevice

SmartDevice is the networking solution for your refrigerator. If your appliance is SmartDevice-enabled or compatible, you can quickly and easily connect your appliance to your WiFi. With the SmartDevice app, you can operate your appliance from a mobile device. Additional functions and setting options are available in the SmartDevice app.

SmartDevice-compatible appliances: Your appliance is compatible for use with the SmartDeviceBox. You must first purchase and install the SmartDeviceBox. In order to connect your appliance to the WiFi, you need to download the SmartDevice app.

- by guests in country houses, hotels, motels and other accommodation,
- for catering and similar services in the wholesale trade.

The appliance is not suitable for freezing food;\*

All other types of use are not permitted.

## Foreseeable misuse

The following applications are expressly forbidden:

- Storing and refrigerating medicines, blood plasma, laboratory preparations or similar substances and products based on the Medical Device Directive 2007/47/EC
- Use in areas at risk of explosions

Misusing the appliance may lead to damage to the goods stored or they may spoil.

## Climate classifications

Depending on the climate classification the appliance is designed to operate in restricted ambient temperatures. The climate classification applying to your appliance is printed on the rating plate.

# 2 General safety instructions

Please keep these operating instructions in a safe place so you can refer back to them at any time.

If you pass the appliance on, please hand these operating instructions to the next user.

Read these operating instructions carefully before use to ensure safe and correct use of the appliance. Follow the instructions, safety instructions and warning messages included at all times. They are important for ensuring you can operate and install the appliance safely and without any problems.

## Danger for the user:

- This device can be used by children and people with impaired physical, sensory or mental abilities or with a lack of experience and knowledge provided that they are supervised or have received instruction in the safe use of this device, and about the resulting hazards. Children must not play with this appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance work must not be carried out by children without adult supervision. Children aged between 3 and 8 are allowed to load and unload the appliance. Children below the age of 3 must be kept away from the appliance unless they are under continuous adult supervision.
- The socket must be easily accessible so that the appliance can be disconnected quickly from the electricity in an emergency. It must not be located in the area behind the appliance.
- When disconnecting the appliance from the supply, always take hold of the plug. Do not pull the cable.
- In the event of a fault pull out the mains plug or deactivate the fuse.
- Do not damage the mains power cable. Do not operate the appliance with a defective mains power cable.
- Only customer service or other specially trained staff may repair or perform other operations on the appliance.



- Only install, connect and dispose of the appliance according to the instructions.
- Only use the appliance when is installed.

## Fire hazard:

- The coolant used (information on the model plate) is ecofriendly but also flammable. Any leaking coolant may ignite.
  - Do not damage the refrigerant circuit pipes.
  - Do not handle ignition sources inside the appliance.
  - Do not use electrical appliances inside the appliance (e.g. steam cleaners, heaters, ice cream makers, etc.).
  - If the refrigerant leaks: remove any naked flames or ignition sources from the vicinity of the leakage point. Properly air the room. Inform customer services.
- Do not store explosives or sprays using combustible propellants such as butane, propane, pentane, etc. in the appliance. To identify these spray cans, look for the list of contents printed on the can, or a flame symbol. Gases possibly escaping may ignite due to electrical components.
- Keep burning candles, lamps and other items with naked flames away from the appliance so that they do not set the appliance on fire.
- Please be sure to store alcoholic drinks or other packaging containing alcohol in tightly closed containers. Any alcohol that leaks out may be ignited by electrical components.

## Danger of tipping and falling:

- Do not misuse the plinth, drawers, doors etc. as a step or for support. This applies particularly to children.

- Do not consume food which has been stored too long.

## Danger of frostbite, numbness and pain:

- Avoid prolonged skin contact with cold surfaces or refrigerated/frozen goods or take protective measures, e.g wear gloves.

## 3 Putting into operation

### 3.1 Switching on appliance

Ensure that the following conditions are met:

- Appliance is installed and connected according to installation instructions.
- All adhesive strips, adhesive and protective films as well as transport safety devices in and on the appliance are removed.
- All marketing leaflets are removed from the drawers.

- ▶ Switch on the appliance using the display.

- ▷ The status display appears.

### The appliance starts in DemoMode:

If the appliance starts in DemoMode, you can deactivate DemoMode within the next 5 minutes.

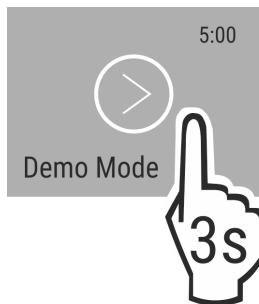

- ▶ Press DemoMode for 3 seconds.
- ▷ DemoMode is deactivated.

### Note

The manufacturer recommends:

- ▶ Place the food inside: Wait for around 6 hours until the set temperature is reached.
- ▶ **Store frozen foods** at -18 °C or colder.\*

## 4 Foods management

### 4.1 Storing food



### WARNING

Risk of fire

- ▶ Do not use any electrical appliances in the food area of the appliance unless recommended by the manufacturer.

### Note

The energy consumption increases and the cooling power goes down if ventilation is not sufficient.

- ▶ Always keep air slots clear.

When storing food, always observe the following:

- Air vents on the inside rear wall are unobstructed.
- Food is in sealed packaging.
- Foods that easily absorb or give off smell or taste are stored in sealed containers or covered.
- Raw meat and fish are in clean, sealed containers to prevent them coming into contact with or dripping onto other foods.
- Liquids are in sealed containers.
- Foods are not stored too closely together, as the air needs to circulate.

### Note

Failure to follow these guidelines can lead to food perishing.

#### 4.1.1 Fridge section

The natural air circulation creates a range of temperatures.

#### Arrange your food as follows:

- ▶ In the top section and in the door: butter and cheese, preserves and tubes.
- ▶ In the coldest zone Fig. 1 (C): Perishable foods such as ready-to-eat meals, meat and sausages
- ▶ On the bottom shelf: Raw meat and fish

#### 4.1.2 EasyFresh-Safe

This compartment is great for non-packaged foods, such as fruit and vegetables.

The air moisture in the compartment depends on the moisture content of the items being stored and the number of times the door is opened. You can adjust the air moisture.

#### Arrange your food as follows:

- ▶ Store your loose fruit and vegetables.
- ▶ Excessive air moisture: Regulate the air humidity (see 7.9 Adjusting the moisture levels).

#### 4.1.3 Freezer compartment\*

The air temperature can vary in the compartment when shown on a thermometer or other gauges. The temperature varies more when the compartment is half-full or empty and can rise to more than -18 °C.

#### Freezing food

You can freeze as many kilograms of fresh food within 24 hours as is indicated on the model plate.

So that the food is rapidly frozen through to the core, keep to the following quantities per pack:

- Fruit, vegetables up to 1 kg
- Meat up to 2.5 kg

#### Arrange your food as follows:



## CAUTION

Risk of injury from glass fragments!  
 Drink bottles and cans may explode if frozen. This applies particularly to carbonated drinks.

▶ Do not freeze bottles and cans of drink!

▶ Put the packaged food into the freezer compartment so that it is in contact with the floor or the side walls.

## Defrost the food

- In the fridge
- In the microwave
- In the stove/oven
- At room temperature



## WARNING

Risk of food poisoning!

▶ Do not re-freeze thawed food.  
 ▶ Use defrosted foodstuff as soon as possible.

▶ Only take out the food you need at the time.  
 ▶ Cook defrosted food as soon as possible.

## 4.2 Storage times

Refer to the specified storage times as a guide.

In the case of foods with a minimum shelf life, the date indicated on the packaging still applies.

### 4.2.1 Fridge section

Always follow the best-before date stated on the packaging.

### 4.2.2 Freezer compartment\*

Recommended shelf-lives for various types of food		
Ice cream	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Cold cuts, ham	at -18 °C	2 to 3 months
Bread, baked goods	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Game, pork	at -18 °C	6 to 9 months
Fatty fish	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Lean fish	at -18 °C	6 to 8 months
Cheese	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Poultry, beef	at -18 °C	6 to 12 months
Vegetables, fruit	at -18 °C	6 to 12 months

## 5 Saving energy

- Pay attention to good ventilation. Do not cover ventilation holes or grids.
- Do not install the appliance in direct sunlight, next to an oven, radiator or similar.
- Energy consumption depends on the installation conditions, e.g. the ambient temperature (see 1.4 Appliance range of use) . A warmer ambient temperature can increase the energy consumption.
- Open the appliance for as short a time as possible.
- The lower the temperature is set the higher the energy consumption.
- Sort your food: [home.liebherr.com/food](http://home.liebherr.com/food).
- Keep all food properly packed and covered. This prevents frost from forming.

- Only take food out for as long as necessary so that it doesn't warm up too much.
- Inserting warm food: allow to cool down to room temperature first.
- Thaw frozen food in the refrigerator.\*
- If there is a thick layer of frost in the appliance: defrost the appliance.\*
- For longer periods of absence, use HolidayMode (see HolidayMode) .

## 6 Controls

### 6.1 Controls and displays

The display gives you a quick overview of the temperature setting and the status of functions and settings. Select or adjust functions by activating/deactivating or selecting a value.

#### 6.1.1 Status display

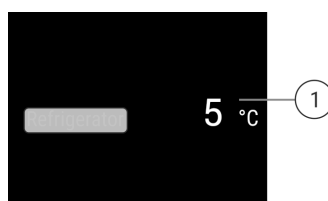

#### 6.1.2 Navigation

Navigate in the menu to access the individual functions. An audible signal sounds after confirming a function or setting. If no selection is made after 10 seconds, the display switches to the Status display.

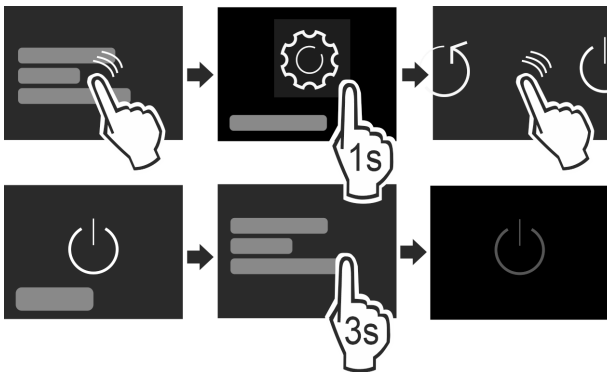

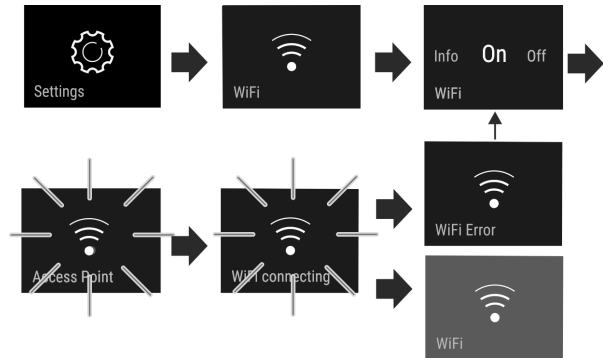

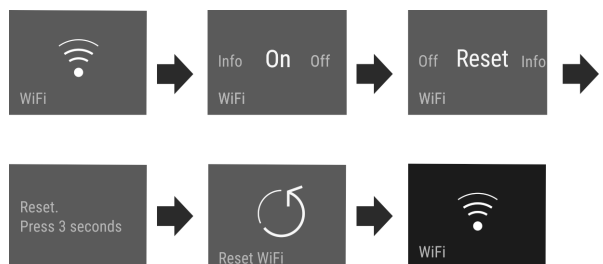

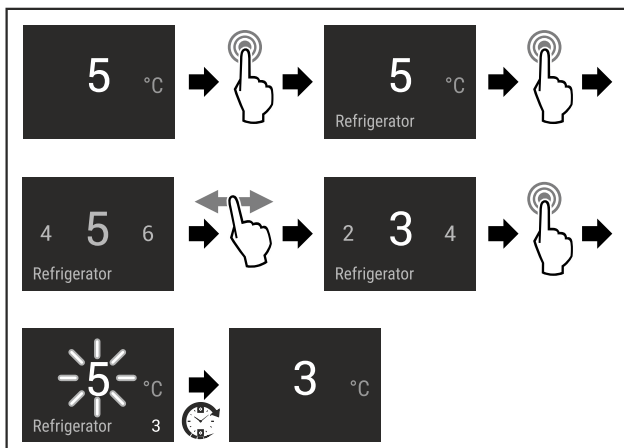

## C5 C-Value\*

The *C-Value* enables the 4-star freezer compartment to be set to a slightly warmer or colder temperature.\*

The *C-Value* is set to **C5** by default.\*

The 4-star freezer compartment becomes colder if the value is set to less than **C5**. The 4-star freezer compartment becomes warmer if the value is set to more than **C5**.\*

### Selecting the setting value\*

- ▶ Set value in customer menu (see 6.2 Control concept) .

## SuperCool

This function selects the lowest cooling temperature. This gives you colder storage temperatures.

This function is relevant to the fridge section Fig. 1 (A)

You can also reach lower temperatures in the 4-star freezer.\*

Use:

- Cool large amounts of food quickly.
- Freeze food.\*

### Activating/deactivating the function

- ▶ Using the 4-star freezer: activate the function when you add the goods.\*
- ▶ Using the fridge section: activate the function when you add the goods.
- ▶ Activating/deactivating (see 6.2 Control concept) .

The function automatically turns off. The appliance goes back to normal mode. The temperature adjusts itself to the set level.

## PartyMode

This option offers an assortment of special functions and settings that are useful if you are having a party.

The following functions are on:

- *SuperCool*

All the functions can be adjusted flexibly and separately. Changes are discarded when the function turns off.

### Activating/deactivating the function

- ▶ Activating/deactivating (see 6.2 Control concept) .
- ▷ On: All functions are activated at the same time.
- ▷ Deactivated: Previously set temperatures are restored.

After 24 hours the function turns off automatically.

## HolidayMode

This function minimises the energy consumption during an extended absence. The temperature of the refrigerator compartment is set to 15 °C and this is displayed on the status screen when the temperature has been reached.

Use:

- Save energy if you plan to be away for a while.
- Avoid coming home to bad smells and mould.

### Activating/deactivating the function

- ▶ Empty everything from the fridge section.
- ▶ Activating/deactivating (see 6.2 Control concept) .
- ▷ On: Fridge temperature is raised.
- ▷ Off: the previously set temperature is restored.

## SabbathMode

With this function you can activate or deactivate the SabbathMode. If you activate this function, some electronic functions will be switched off. This allows your appliance to meet religious requirements on Jewish holidays such as the Sabbath and comply with STAR-K Kosher certification.

Appliance status with active SabbathMode
The status display continuously shows SabbathMode.
All functions in the display except the <b>Deactivate SabbathMode function</b> are locked.
Active functions remain active.
The display stays lit when you close the door.
The interior lighting is off.
Reminders are disabled. The set time intervals are paused.
Reminders and warnings are not displayed.
There is no door alarm.
There is no temperature alarm.
The defrost cycle only works for the specified time without taking account of appliance use.
After a power failure, the appliance returns to SabbathMode.

## Activating SabbathMode



### WARNING

Danger of food poisoning from spoiled food!

If you have SabbathMode activated and a power failure occurs, no message appears in the status display about the power failure. Once the power is restored, the appliance continues to operate in SabbathMode. The power failure may mean that food spoils and the consumption of this food could lead to food poisoning.

After a power failure:

- ▶ Do not consume food that was frozen and has thawed out.

- ▶ Call up the settings menu. (see 6.2 Control concept)
- ▶ Swipe left or right until corresponding function is displayed.

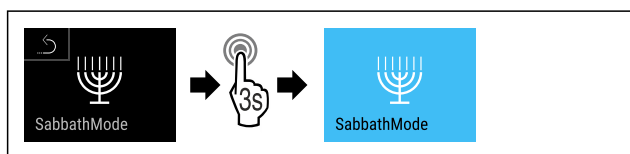

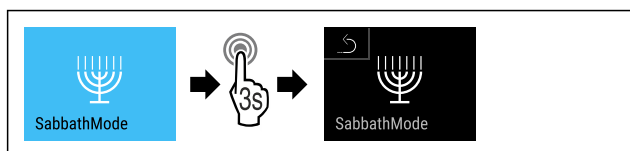

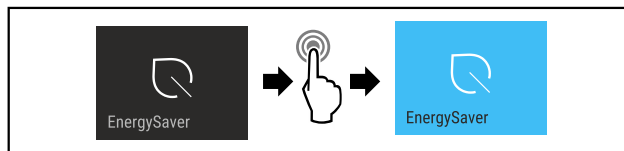

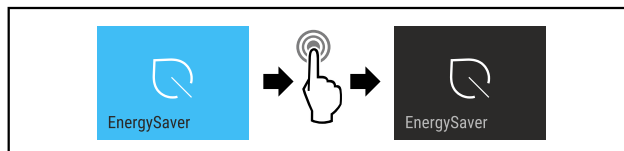

- ▷ The status display appears.

- ▶ Contact customer service. (see 9.4 Customer Service)

### 6.4.2 DemoMode

If "D" appears on the display, demo mode is on. This option is designed for retailers, as it turns off all the cooling functions.

## Stopping DemoMode

If you see the following running in the display:

- ▶ Confirm the display within the countdown.
- ▷ DemoMode is off.
- If the timer is not running:
- ▶ Unplug the appliance.
- ▶ Plug the appliance in again.
- ▷ DemoMode is off.

### 7.1 4-star freezer compartment\*

#### 7.1.1 Opening/closing the freezer compartment

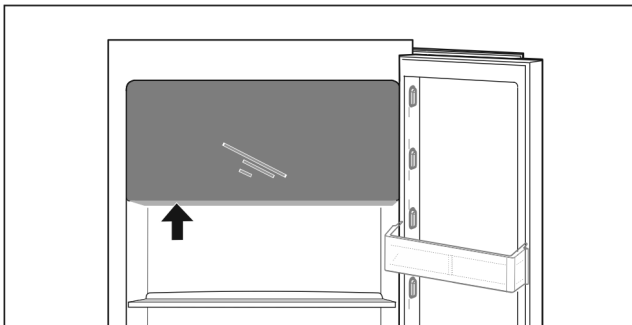
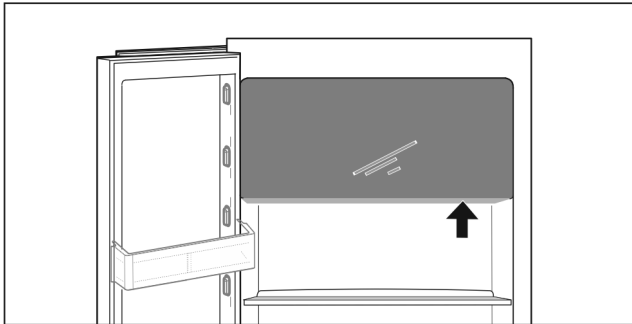

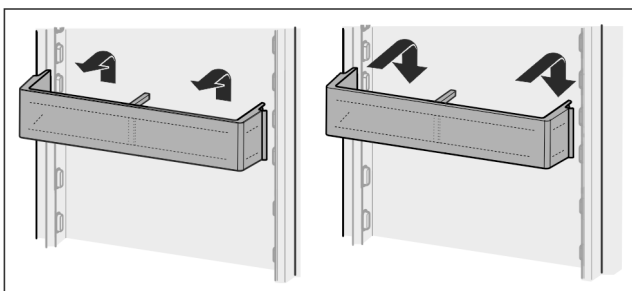

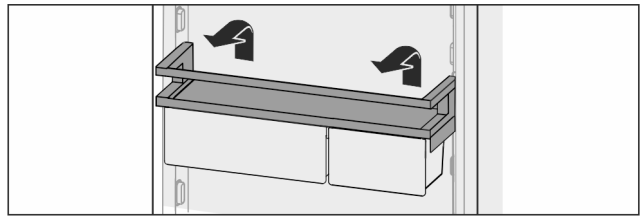

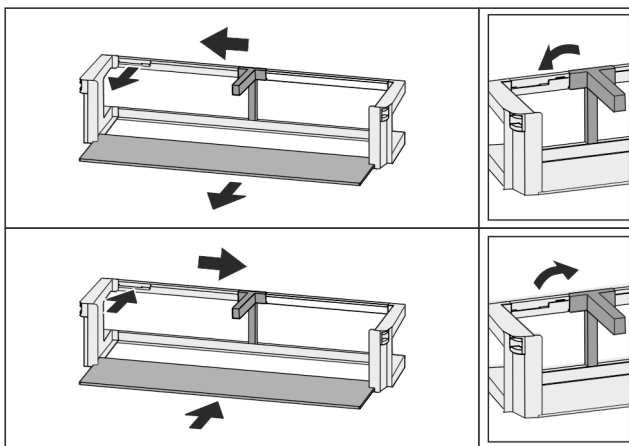

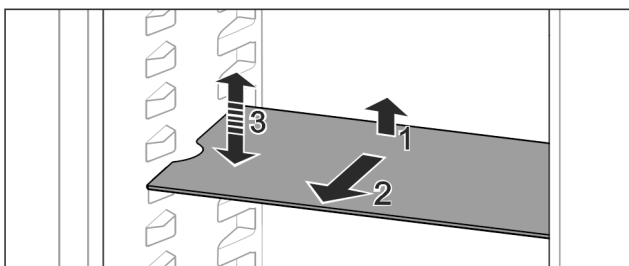

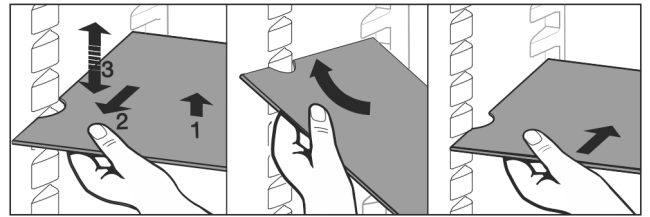

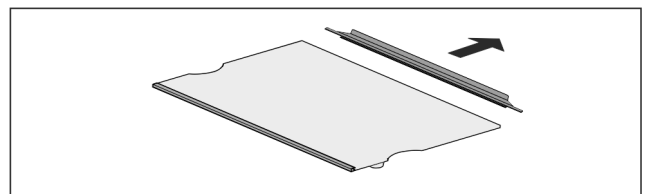

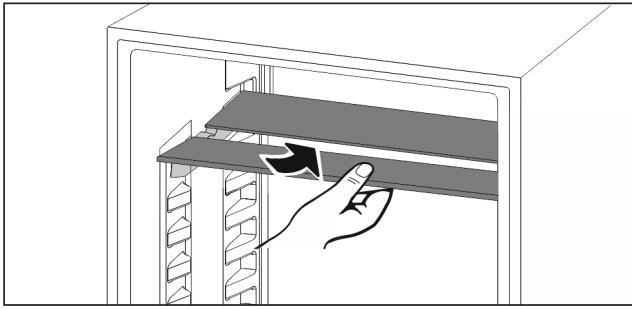

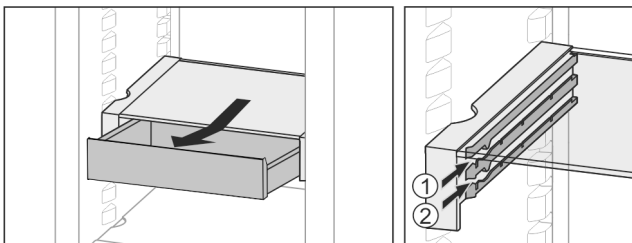

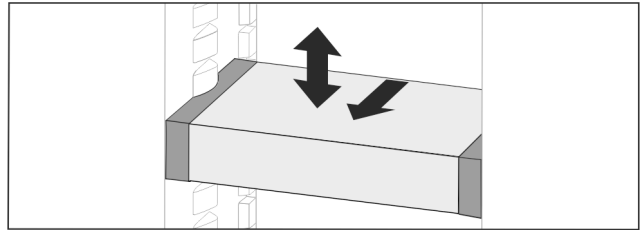

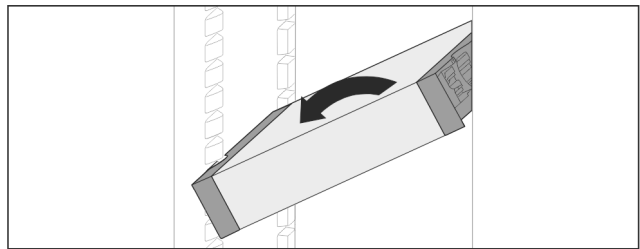

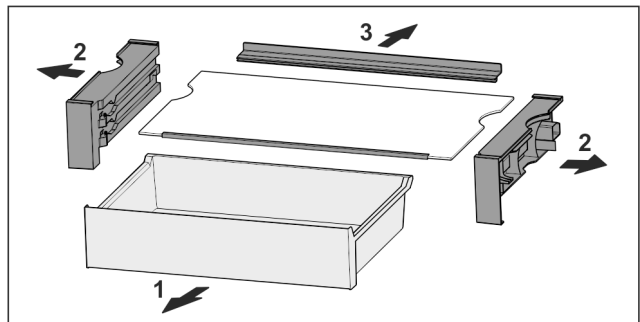

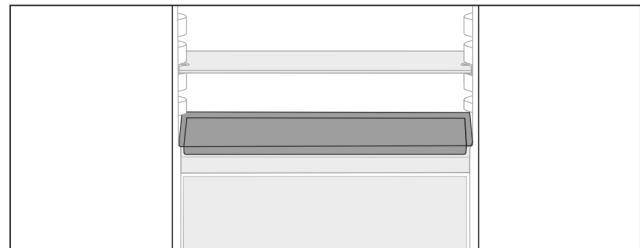

## 7.7 Drawers

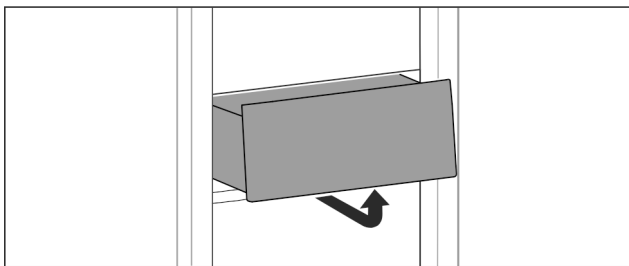

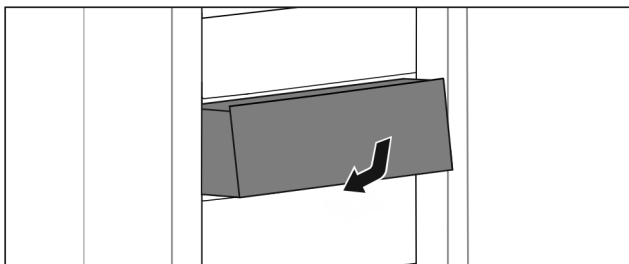

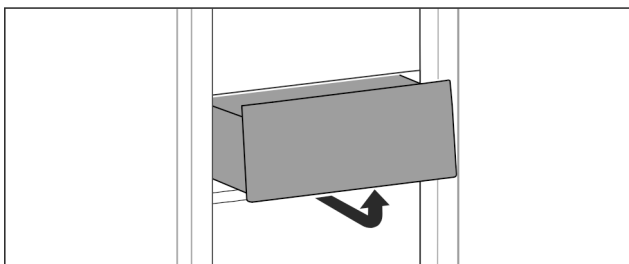

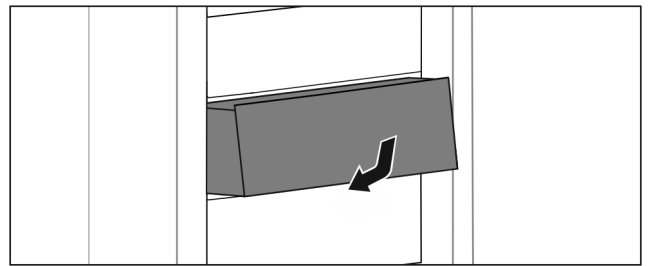

Drawers which are fully extendible can be pulled out fully from the appliance. Drawers with partial pull-out cannot be removed fully from the appliance. The system in your appliance depends on the type of appliance.

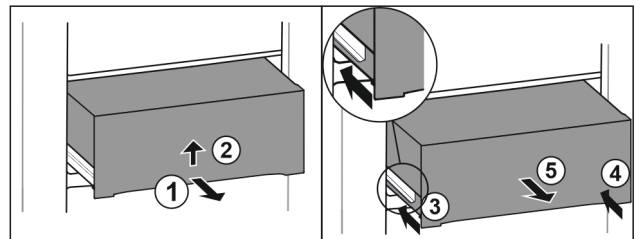

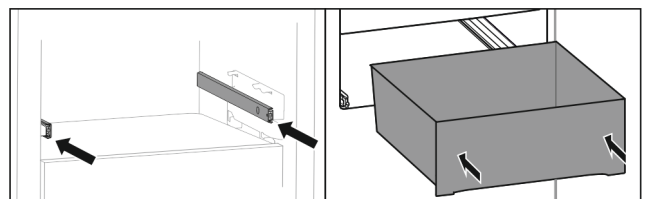

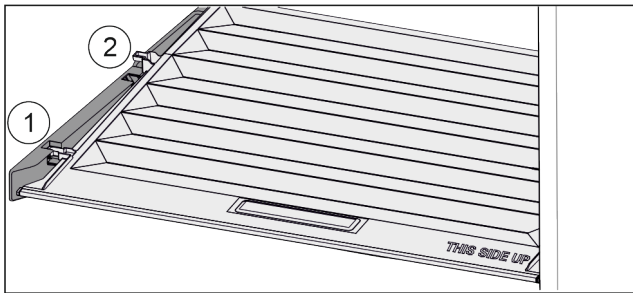

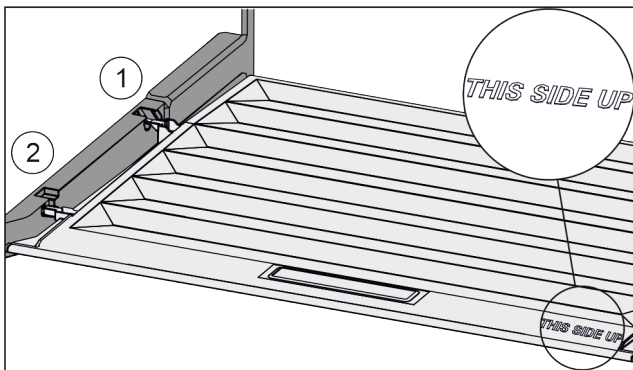

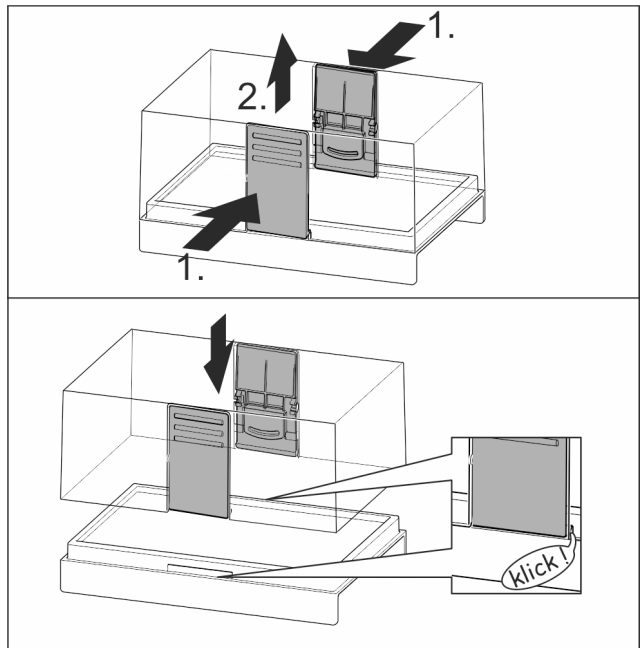

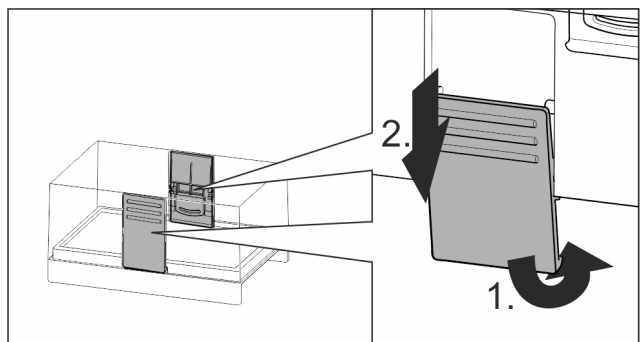

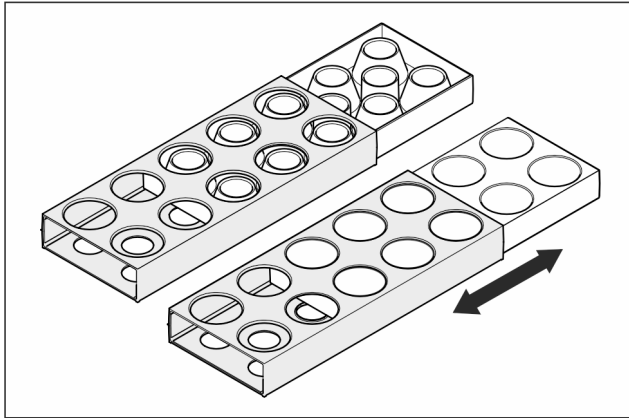

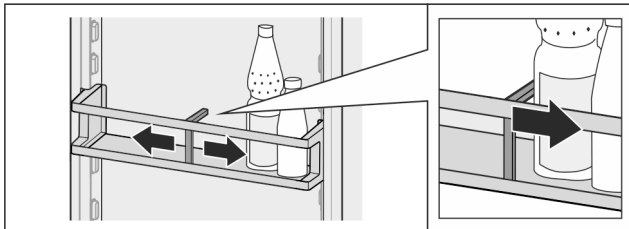

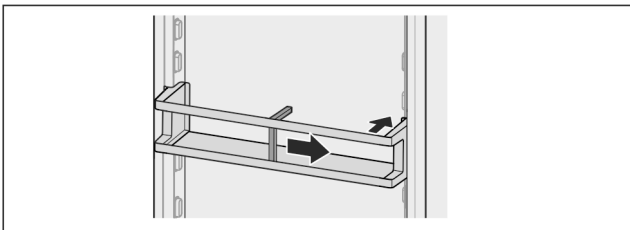

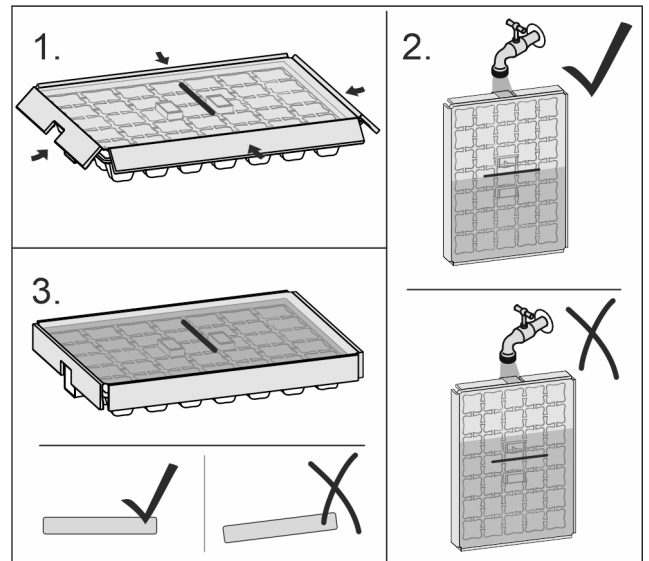

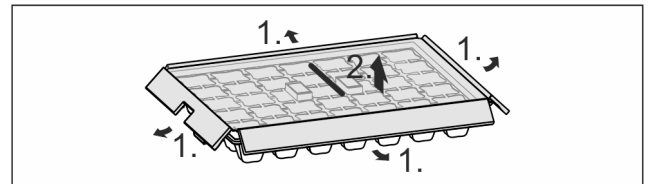

## 8 Maintenance

### 8.1 Disassembling / assembling pull-out systems

#### 8.1.1 Notes on disassembly

You can disassemble some of the pull-out systems for cleaning. Your appliance can contain a variety of pull-out systems.

The following pull-out systems can be disassembled or cannot be disassembled:

Pull-out system	can be disassembled / cannot be disassembled
Drawer on appliance base or glass shelf	cannot be disassembled
Drawer on rails	cannot be disassembled
Partial pull-out fridge compartment	cannot be disassembled

## 8.2 Defrosting the appliance



### WARNING

Improper defrosting of the appliance!  
Injuries and damage.

- ▶ Do not use mechanical equipment or other methods to speed up the defrosting process other than those recommended by the manufacturer.
- ▶ Do not use electrical heating or steam-cleaning appliances, naked flames or defroster sprays to defrost.
- ▶ Do not use sharp objects to remove ice.

Defrosting is performed automatically. The water from the thawing process drains through the outlet and evaporates.

Water drops or a thin layer of frost or ice can form on the back wall; this is a completely normal part of the appliance's function. This must not be removed.

A layer of frost or ice can form briefly due to the energy-optimised control of the device.

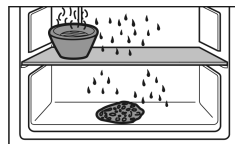
- ▶ Clean the drain opening regularly (see 8.4 Cleaning the appliance).

## 8.3 Defrosting the freezer compartment manually\*

A layer of frost or ice forms after prolonged use.

The following factors promote the formation of frost or ice:

- The appliance is opened frequently.
- Hot food is put in.
- ▶ Switch off the appliance.
- ▶ Pull out the mains plug or switch off the fuse.
- ▶ Wrap the frozen produce in newspaper or blankets and store in a cool place.



- ▶ Place a pan of hot water (not boiling) on the middle shelf.
- ▷ This speeds up the defrosting process.
- ▶ Leave the compartment and appliance door open during defrosting.
- ▶ Remove loosened pieces of ice.
- ▶ Make sure that there is no melted ice water in the cabinet.
- ▶ Soak up the melted ice water with a sponge or cloth several times as necessary.
- ▶ Clean the appliance (see 8.4 Cleaning the appliance).

## 8.4 Cleaning the appliance

### 8.4.1 Ready



### WARNING

Danger of electric shock!

- ▶ Remove the refrigerator connector or interrupt the power supply.



### WARNING

Risk of fire

- ▶ Do not damage the refrigeration circuit.

- ▶ Empty the appliance.
- ▶ Remove mains connector.

-or-

- ▶ Activate CleaningMode. (see CleaningMode)

### 8.4.2 Cleaning the interior

#### NOTICE

Improper cleaning!  
Damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Only use soft cleaning cloths and ph-neutral all-purpose cleaners.
- ▶ Do not use abrasive sponges or steel wool which may cause scratches.
- ▶ Do not use any sharp or abrasive cleaning agents, nor any that contain sand, chloride or acid.

- ▶ Plastic surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Metal surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Drain hole: remove deposits using a thin item (for example a cotton bud).

### 8.4.3 Clean the components

#### NOTICE

Improper cleaning!  
Damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Only use soft cleaning cloths and ph-neutral all-purpose cleaners.
- ▶ Do not use abrasive sponges or steel wool which may cause scratches.

#### Clean with a soft, clean cloth, lukewarm water and some detergent:

- Drawer

#### Clean with a damp cloth:

- Retractable rails
- Please note: The grease in the tracks is used for lubrication and must not be removed!

#### Wash in the dishwasher up to 60 °C:

- Door rack
- VarioBox
- Bottle rack
- Shelf
- Dividing shelf
- Holder of the dividing shelf
- Egg rack
- Butter dish
- Ice cube tray\*
- ▶ To disassemble components: see the relevant section.
- ▶ Clean the components.

### 8.4.4 After cleaning

- ▶ Wipe the appliance and the components dry.
- ▶ Connect and switch on the appliance.  
The temperature is cold enough:
- ▶ Place the food inside.
- ▶ Repeat cleaning regularly.

## 9.2 Operating noises

The appliance makes different noises when it is on.

- At **higher temperatures** the appliance uses less energy but works for longer. It is **quieter**.
- At **lower temperatures** the food is cooled faster. It is **louder**.

Examples:

- Functions on (see 6.3 Appliance functions)
- Food recently added
- High ambient temperature
- Door open for a while

Noise	Possible cause	Type of noise
Bubbling and splashing	Coolant flowing into the cooling circuit.	Normal operating noise
Hissing	Coolant sprays into the cooling circuit.	Normal operating noise
Humming	The appliance is cooling. The volume depends on the cooling output.	Normal operating noise

Noise	Possible cause	Type of noise
Suction noises	Soft-closing door is being opened and closed.	Normal operating noise
Clicking	Components are switched on and off.	Normal switching noise
Rattling or humming	Valves or flaps are working.	Normal switching noise

Noise	Possible cause	Type of noise	Lifting
Vibration	Improper installation	Defective noise	Check the installation. Level the appliance.
Rattling	Components, items inside the appliance	Defective noise	Secure components. Leave enough space between the items.

## 9.3 Technical fault

Your appliance is designed and built to ensure it works reliably and has a long service life. In the unlikely event that a fault occurs during operation, please check whether it is due to an operating error. If so, you will be charged for the callout and repair costs even if it falls within the warranty period.

You can fix the following faults yourself.

### 9.3.1 Appliance function

Defect	Cause	Remedy
<b>The appliance is not working.</b>	→ The appliance is not switched on.	▶ Switch the appliance on.
	→ The power plug is not properly plugged into the socket.	▶ Check the power plug.
	→ There is something wrong with the power outlet fuse.	▶ Check the fuse.
	→ Power cut	▶ Keep the appliance closed. ▶ Protecting food: Lay freezer packs on top of the food or use another freezer if the power is off for a prolonged period. ▶ Do not re-freeze defrosted food,
	→ The appliance plug does not fit the appliance properly.	▶ Check the appliance plug.
<b>Temperature is not cold enough.</b>	→ The appliance door is not closed properly.	▶ Close the appliance door.
	→ Not enough ventilation.	▶ Keep ventilation grille clear, and clean it.
	→ The ambient temperature is too high.	▶ Solution: (see 1.4 Appliance range of use) .
	→ The appliance was opened too many times or for too long.	▶ Wait to see if the required temperature corrects itself. If not, contact Customer Service. (see 9.4 Customer Service)



Defect	Cause	Remedy
	→ The temperature is set incorrectly.	▶ Turn down the temperature and check after 24 hours.
	→ The appliance is too close to a heat source (oven, radiator, etc).	▶ Move the appliance or the heat source.
	→ The appliance was not correctly installed in the recess.	▶ Check if the appliance was installed correctly and that the door closes properly.
<b>The door seal is defective or needs to be replaced for another reason.</b>	→ The door seal can be replaced. It can be replaced without the need for special tools.	▶ Contact Customer Service. (see 9.4 Customer Service)
<b>The appliance builds up too much ice or condensation.</b>	→ The door seal may have slipped out of its groove.	▶ Check that the door seal is well fitted in the groove.

## 9.3.2 Features

Defect	Cause	Remedy
<b>The internal light does not come on.</b>	→ The appliance is not switched on.	▶ Switch the appliance on.
	→ The door was open for longer than 15 minutes.	▶ Interior lighting turns off automatically after approx. 15 min. with the door open.
	→ The LED interior light is faulty or the lid is damaged.	▶ Contact Customer Service. (see 9.4 Customer Service)
<b>The freezer compartment cannot be closed.*</b>	→ The lock is on when the door is open.	▶ Use the handle again.

## 9.4 Customer Service

First check whether you can rectify the fault yourself (see 9 Customer help) . If you cannot rectify the problem, contact Customer Service.

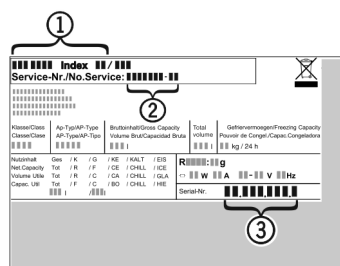

# Disposal

---

- ▶ Switch off appliance. (see Turn off appliance)
- ▶ Remove mains connector.
- ▶ Remove appliance connector if required: Remove and move from left to right at the same time.
- ▶ Clean appliance. (see 8.4 Cleaning the appliance)
- ▶ Leave the door open to avoid bad smells building up.

- ▶ Dispose of batteries, lamps and the appliance according to the above specifications.

## 11 Disposal

### 11.1 Preparing appliance for disposal



**Li-Ion**

Liebherr uses batteries in some of its appliances. In the EU, for environmental reasons, legislation obliges the end user to remove these batteries before disposing of old appliances. If your appliance contains batteries, a corresponding notice is attached.

**Lamps** If you can remove the lamps yourself without destroying them, also remove these before disposal.

- ▶ Take the appliance out of operation.
- ▶ Appliances with batteries: remove the batteries. For description, see **Maintenance** chapter.
- ▶ If possible: remove lamps without destroying them.

### 11.2 Disposing of the appliance in an environmentally friendly manner



The appliance still contains valuable materials and must be disposed of separately from unsorted municipal waste.

Dispose of batteries separately from the old appliance. To do this, you can return the batteries free of charge to retailers as well as recycling centres and collection centres for recyclable materials.

**Lamps** Dispose of removed lamps via the respective collection systems.

For Germany:

You can dispose of the appliance free of charge via the class 1 collection containers at the local recycling and recyclable material collection centres. When purchasing a new fridge/freezer, if the sales area > 400 m<sup>2</sup>, retailers will also take back the old appliance free of charge.



#### **WARNING**

Leaking coolant and oil!

Fire. The coolant contained in the appliance is eco-friendly, but also flammable. The oil contained in the appliance is flammable. Escaping coolant and oil can ignite if the concentration is high enough and in contact with an external heat source.

- ▶ Transport the appliance without damaging it.

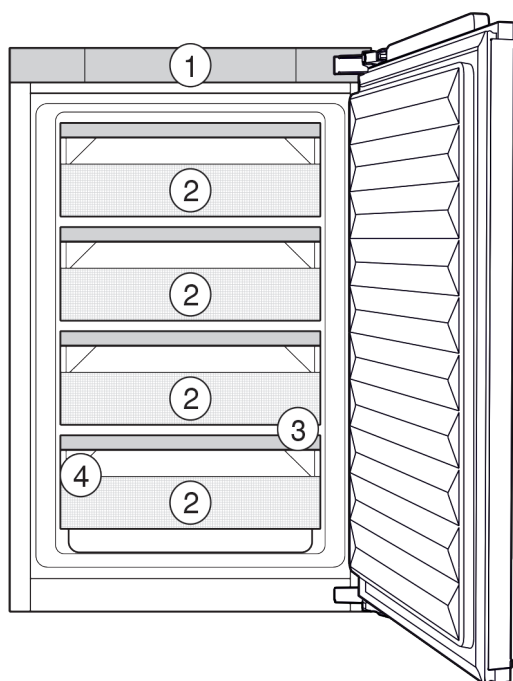


Fig. 1 Example illustration

#### Note

- Shelves, drawers and baskets are arranged for optimum energy efficiency when the appliance is delivered. Changing how the shelves, for example, are inserted in the fridge compartment does not have any impact on energy consumption.

### 1.3 Appliance range of use

#### Intended use

The appliance is only suitable for cooling food products in a domestic or household-like environment. This includes, for example, use:

- in staff kitchens, bed and breakfast establishments,

- by guests in country houses, hotels, motels and other accommodation,
- for catering and similar services in the wholesale trade.

The appliance is not suitable for freezing food;

All other types of use are not permitted.

#### Foreseeable misuse

The following applications are expressly forbidden:

- Storing and refrigerating medicines, blood plasma, laboratory preparations or similar substances and products based on the Medical Device Directive 2007/47/EC
- Use in areas at risk of explosions

Misusing the appliance may lead to damage to the goods stored or they may spoil.

#### Climate classifications

Depending on the climate classification the appliance is designed to operate in restricted ambient temperatures. The climate classification applying to your appliance is printed on the rating plate.

#### Note

- Keep to the specified ambient temperatures in order to guarantee that the appliance works properly.

# General safety instructions

## 2 General safety instructions

Please keep these operating instructions in a safe place so you can refer back to them at any time.

If you pass the appliance on, please hand these operating instructions to the next user.

Read these operating instructions carefully before use to ensure safe and correct use of the appliance. Follow the instructions, safety instructions and warning messages included at all times. They are important for ensuring you can operate and install the appliance safely and without any problems.

### Danger for the user:

- This device can be used by children and people with impaired physical, sensory or mental abilities or with a lack of experience and knowledge provided that they are supervised or have received instruction in the safe use of this device, and about the resulting hazards. Children must not play with this appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance work must not be carried out by children without adult supervision. Children aged between 3 and 8 are allowed to load and unload the appliance. Children below the age of 3 must be kept away from the appliance unless they are under continuous adult supervision.
- The socket must be easily accessible so that the appliance can be disconnected quickly from the electricity in an emergency. It must not be located in the area behind the appliance.
- When disconnecting the appliance from the supply, always take hold of the plug. Do not pull the cable.
- In the event of a fault pull out the mains plug or deactivate the fuse.
- Do not damage the mains power cable. Do not operate the appliance with a defective mains power cable.
- Only customer service or other specially trained staff may repair or perform other operations on the appliance.
- Only install, connect and dispose of the appliance according to the instructions.
- Only use the appliance when is installed.

### Fire hazard:

- The coolant used (information on the model plate) is ecofriendly but also flammable. Any leaking coolant may ignite.
  - Do not damage the refrigerant circuit pipes.

- Do not handle ignition sources inside the appliance.
- Do not use electrical appliances inside the appliance (e.g. steam cleaners, heaters, ice cream makers, etc.).
- If the refrigerant leaks: remove any naked flames or ignition sources from the vicinity of the leakage point. Properly air the room. Inform customer services.
- Do not store explosives or sprays using combustible propellants such as butane, propane, pentane, etc. in the appliance. To identify these spray cans, look for the list of contents printed on the can, or a flame symbol. Gases possibly escaping may ignite due to electrical components.
- Keep burning candles, lamps and other items with naked flames away from the appliance so that they do not set the appliance on fire.
- Please be sure to store alcoholic drinks or other packaging containing alcohol in tightly closed containers. Any alcohol that leaks out may be ignited by electrical components.

### Danger of tipping and falling:

- Do not misuse the plinth, drawers, doors etc. as a step or for support. This applies particularly to children.

### Danger of food poisoning:

- Do not consume food which has been stored too long.

### Danger of frostbite, numbness and pain:

- Avoid prolonged skin contact with cold surfaces or refrigerated/frozen goods or take protective measures, e.g wear gloves.

### Danger of injury and damage:

- Hot steam can lead to injury. Do not use electrical heating or steam cleaning equipment, open flames or defrosting sprays to defrost.
- Do not use sharp implements to remove the ice.

### Risk of crushing:

- Do not hold the hinge when opening and closing the door. Fingers may get caught.

### Symbols on the appliance:



This symbol may be located on the compressor. It relates to the oil in the compressor and makes reference to the risk that: Swallowing or inhaling can be fatal. This advice is only relevant to recycling. There is no danger in normal operation.





This symbol is located on the compressor and indicates the danger of flammable materials. Do not remove the sticker.



This or a similar sticker may be located on the rear of the appliance. It refers to the foam-padded panels in the door and/or the housing. This advice is only relevant to recycling. Do not remove the sticker.

## 3 Putting into operation

### 3.1 Switching on appliance

Ensure that the following conditions are met:

- Appliance is installed and connected according to installation instructions.
- All adhesive strips, adhesive and protective films as well as transport safety devices in and on the appliance are removed.
- All marketing leaflets are removed from the drawers.

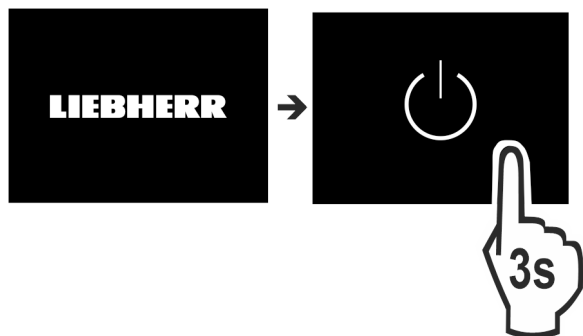

- ▶ Switch on the appliance using the display.

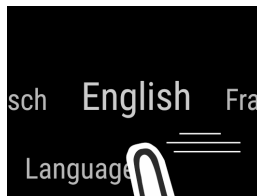

- ▷ The status display appears.

### The appliance starts in DemoMode:

If the appliance starts in DemoMode, you can deactivate DemoMode within the next 5 minutes.

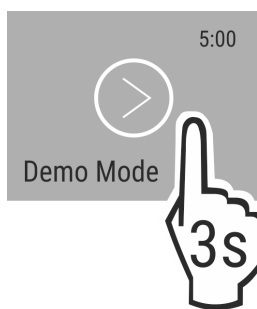

- ▶ Press DemoMode for 3 seconds.
- ▷ DemoMode is deactivated.

### Note

The manufacturer recommends:

- ▶ Place the food inside: Wait for around 6 hours until the set temperature is reached.

## 4 Foods management

### 4.1 Storing food



### WARNING

Risk of fire

- ▶ Do not use any electrical appliances in the food area of the appliance unless recommended by the manufacturer.

### Note

The energy consumption increases and the cooling power goes down if ventilation is not sufficient.

- ▶ Always keep air slots clear.

When storing food, always observe the following:

- Air vents on the inside rear wall are unobstructed.

# Foods management

- Air vents on the fan are unobstructed.
- Food is in sealed packaging.
- Foods that easily absorb or give off smell or taste are stored in sealed containers or covered.
- Raw meat and fish are in clean, sealed containers to prevent them coming into contact with or dripping onto other foods.
- Liquids are in sealed containers.
- Foods are not stored too closely together, as the air needs to circulate.

## Note

Failure to follow these guidelines can lead to food perishing.

### 4.1.1 BioFresh

BioFresh will extend the storage time for some fresh foods compared to traditional refrigeration.

The date indicated on the packaging always applies for foods with a minimum shelf life.

## Note

If the temperatures drop below 0 °C foods may freeze to each other.

- ▶ Do not store cold-sensitive vegetables such as cucumbers, aubergines, courgettes and cold-sensitive tropical fruit in the full-space BioFresh appliance.

For optimal storage of foods, you can regulate the humidity in the appliance using the HumidityPlus function. (see HumidityPlus)

HumidityPlus function	Storage climate	Food
activated	more humid storage climate	loose fruit and vegetables with a high moisture content
deactivated (default setting)	drier storage climate	dry or packaged foods (e.g. dairy produce, meat, fish, sausages)

### Arranging your food

When HumidityPlus is activated:

- ▶ Store loose fruit and vegetables.

When HumidityPlus is deactivated:

- ▶ Store dry or packaged foods (e.g. dairy produce, meat, fish, sausages).

## 4.2 Storage times

Refer to the specified storage times as a guide.

In the case of foods with a minimum shelf life, the date indicated on the packaging still applies.

### 4.2.1 BioFresh

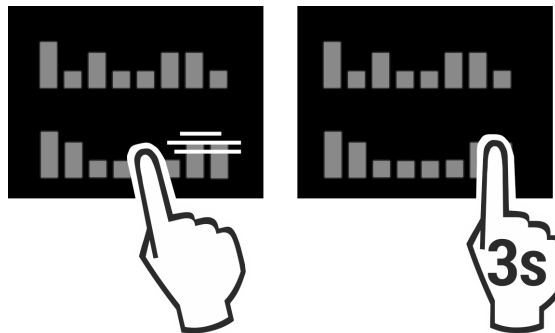

## 5 Saving energy

- Pay attention to good ventilation. Do not cover ventilation holes or grids.
- Always keep the fan air slits clear.
- Do not install the appliance in direct sunlight, next to an oven, radiator or similar.
- Energy consumption depends on the installation conditions, e.g. the ambient temperature (see 1.3 Appliance range of use) . A warmer ambient temperature can increase the energy consumption.
- Open the appliance for as short a time as possible.
- The lower the temperature is set the higher the energy consumption.
- Keep all food properly packed and covered. This prevents frost from forming.
- Only take food out for as long as necessary so that it doesn't warm up too much.
- Inserting warm food: allow to cool down to room temperature first.

## 6 Controls

### 6.1 Controls and displays

The display provides a quick overview of the temperature setting and the status of functions and settings. You can control the functions and settings either by deactivating/activating them or by selecting a value.

#### 6.1.1 Status display

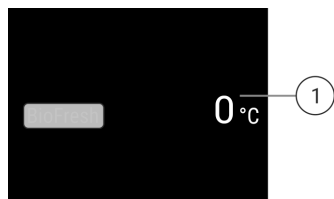

(1) Temperature display

The Status display shows the set temperatures and is the home display. From there, you can navigate to the options and settings.

#### 6.1.2 Navigation

Navigate in the menu to access the individual functions. An audible signal sounds after confirming a function or setting. If no selection is made after 10 seconds the display switches to the Status display.

The appliance is operated by swiping and confirming in the display:

#### Back:

- Confirm your selection in the submenu. The display returns to the menu.



The display returns to the function/setting.

#### Back to Status display:

- Close and open the door.
- Wait 10 seconds. The display switches to the Status display.

### 6.1.3 Display symbols

Display symbols provide information on the current appliance status:

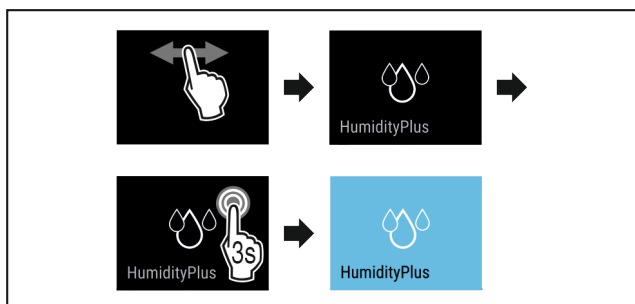

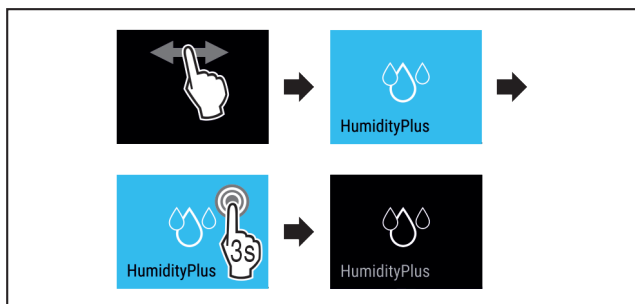

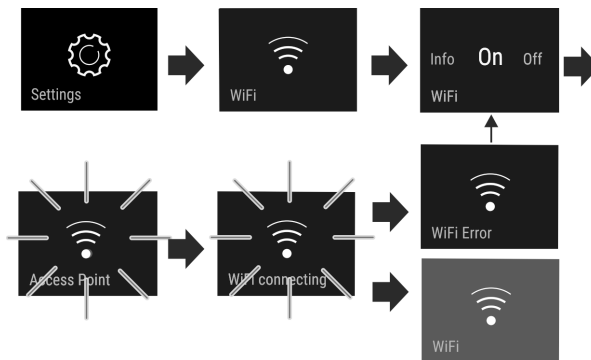

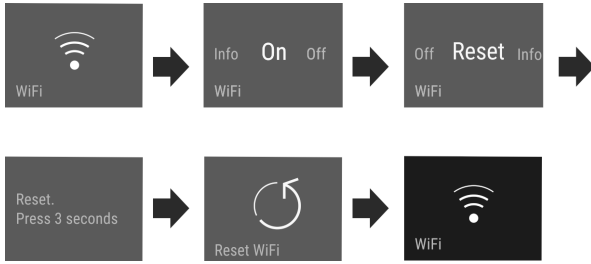

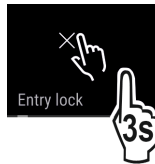

This appliance has certification from the "Institute for Science and Halacha".



## WARNING

Danger of food poisoning.

If there is a power cut while the appliance is in SabbathMode, this message is not saved. Once power is restored, the appliance continues in SabbathMode. When this mode is over no message about the power cut is displayed on the temperature display.


If there was a power cut during SabbathMode:

- Check the food for quality. Do not eat the food if it has thawed.

What the appliance does in SabbathMode:

- The Status display continuously shows SabbathMode.
- The display is locked for all functions apart from deactivating SabbathMode.
- Any functions/settings that are already on, remain active.
- The display stays bright when the door is closed.
- Reminders are disabled. The set time intervals are also paused. This function is disabled in SabbathMode.
- Reminders and warnings are not displayed. There are no acoustic signals, and the display does not show warnings or settings such as temperature alarm or door alarm.
- The internal light is off.
- The defrost cycle only works for the specified time without taking account of fridge use.
- After a power cut the appliance automatically returns to SabbathMode.

## Activating/deactivating SabbathMode

- To activate this function, swipe the display until you see Settings  in the menu and press for 1 second. The menu changes to show the available settings.
- Swipe the display until you see the SabbathMode (Menora) symbol. Press the symbol for 3 seconds.
  - ▷ The display changes colour.
  - ▷ SabbathMode is activated.

To deactivate the function, press the display for 3 seconds.

SabbathMode is deactivated.

## CleaningMode

Use this setting to easily clean the appliance. This setting refers to the fridge section [].

Use:

- Clean the fridge section by hand.

What happens on the appliance when this setting is on:

- The display permanently shows: CleaningMode.
- The fridge section is switched off.
- The internal light is on.
- Reminders and warnings are not shown. There is no acoustic signal.

### Activating/deactivating settings

- ▶ Activating/deactivating the setting (see 6.2 Control concept).
- ▷ On: fridge section is off. Light stays on.
- ▷ Off: preset temperature is restored.

After 60 min the setting turns off automatically. The appliance then continues running in normal mode.

## B5 BioFresh B-Value

When delivered, the temperature in the BioFresh compartment is set to **B5**. The status indicator on the display shows the appropriate target temperature in the full-space BioFresh compartment.

You can change this value slightly if a higher or lower ambient temperature makes it necessary. When setting the value, note:

Value	Description
B1	Lowest temperature
B1-B4	The temperature can drop to below 0 °C which means foods can easily freeze.
B5	Default temperature
B9	Highest temperature

*BioFresh B-Value*

### Selecting the setting value

- ▶ Set value in customer menu (see 6.2 Control concept).
- ▶ Check whether the appliance has reached the desired temperature range in BioFresh.

## Reset

This function resets all settings to the factory settings. All settings that you have made thus far will be reset to their original values.

### Activating the setting

- ▶ Activate (see 6.2 Control concept).

## Turn off appliance

This setting turns off the whole appliance.

### Switching off the entire appliance

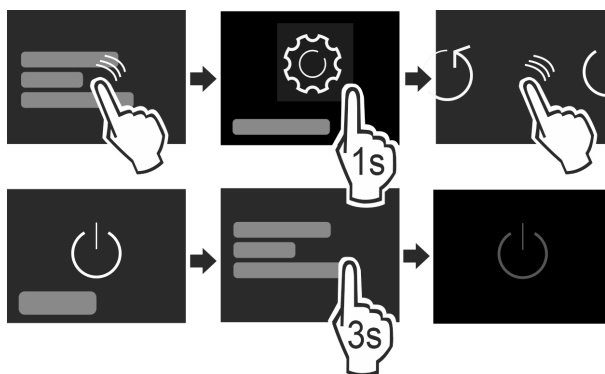

- ▶ Activating/deactivating (see 6.2 Control concept).
- ▷ Off: Display goes black.

## 6.5 Fault messages

Fault messages appear in the display. There are two categories of fault message:

Category	Meaning
Message	Reminder of general procedures. You can carry out these procedures to eliminate the message.
Warning	Appears when there are malfunctions. A signal sounds in addition to the display. The signal becomes louder until you acknowledge by tapping the display. You can eliminate simple defects yourself. For more serious defects, you must contact customer service.

### 6.5.1 Warnings

#### Close the door

This message appears if the door is open for too long. You can set how long it takes for this message to appear.

- ▶ Stop alarm: Confirm the message.

-or-

- ▶ Close the door.

#### Error

This message appears if there is a fault with the appliance. An appliance component indicates a fault.

- ▶ Open the door.
- ▶ Note down the fault code.
- ▶ Confirm the message.
- ▷ The signal tone stops.
- ▷ The status display appears.
- ▶ Close the door.
- ▶ Contact customer service. (see 9.4 Customer Services)

### 6.5.2 DemoMode

If "D" appears on the display, demo mode is on. This option is designed for retailers, as it turns off all the cooling functions.

#### Stopping DemoMode

If you see the following running in the display:

- ▶ Confirm the display within the countdown.
- ▷ DemoMode is off.
- If the timer is not running:
  - ▶ Unplug the appliance.
  - ▶ Plug the appliance in again.
  - ▷ DemoMode is off.

# Features

## 7 Features

### 7.1 Drawers

You can remove the drawers for cleaning.

The way to remove/insert the drawers varies depending on the pull-out system. Your appliance can contain various pull-out systems.

#### Note

The energy consumption increases and the cooling power goes down if ventilation is not sufficient.

- ▶ Always leave the fan air vents clear on the back wall!

#### 7.1.1 Drawer on appliance base or glass shelf

The drawer runs directly on the appliance base or on a glass shelf. There are no rails.

When you remove the drawers, you can use the glass shelves below them as storage shelves.

##### Removing drawer

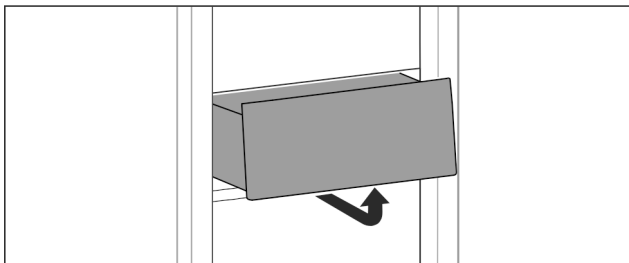

- ▶ Remove drawer as shown in the illustration.

##### Inserting drawer

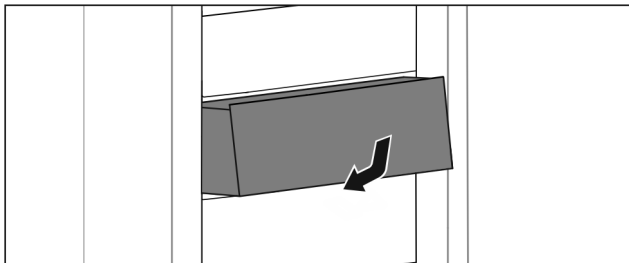

- ▶ Insert drawer as shown in the illustration.

#### 7.1.2 Drawer on moulded rib

The drawer runs directly on the moulded rib. There are no rails.

##### Removing drawer

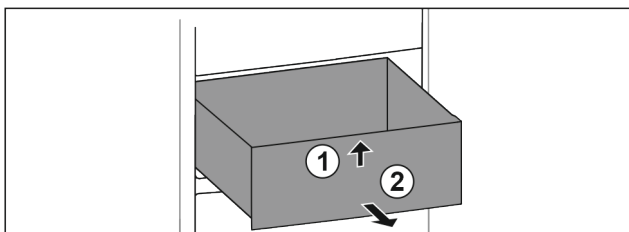

- ▶ Pull out drawer as far as it will go.
- ▶ Lift up drawer at the front. Fig. 15 (1)
- ▶ Remove drawer to the front. Fig. 15 (2)

##### Inserting drawer

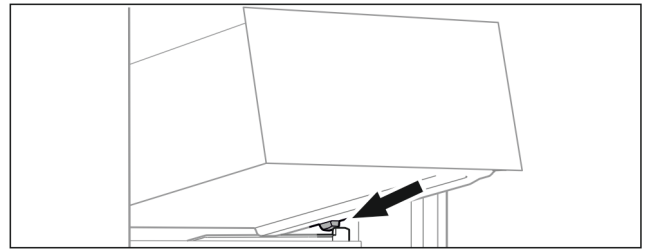

- ▶ Place drawer at an angle behind the stoppers on the moulded rib. (see Fig. 836)
- ▶ Lower drawer.
- ▶ Slide in drawer to the back.

## 8 Maintenance

### 8.1 Disassembling / assembling pull-out systems

You can disassemble some of the pull-out systems for cleaning. Your appliance can contain various pull-out systems.

The following pull-out systems can be disassembled or cannot be disassembled:

Pull-out system	can be disassembled / cannot be disassembled
Drawer on appliance base or glass shelf	cannot be disassembled
Drawer on moulded rib	can be disassembled (see 8.2 Drawer on moulded rib)

#### 8.2 Drawer on moulded rib

##### 8.2.1 Disassembling pull-out system

Make sure the following prerequisites are met:

- Drawer has been removed. (see 7.1.2 Drawer on moulded rib)

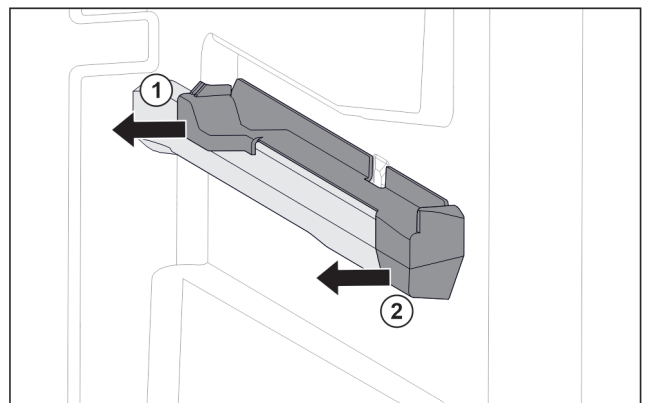


Fig. 17 Attachment on the right moulded rib

- ▶ Grab attachment at the back from below.
- ▶ Pull off attachment at the back sideways. Fig. 17 (1)
- ▶ Pull off attachment at the front sideways. Fig. 17 (2)



## 8.2.2 Installing pull-out system

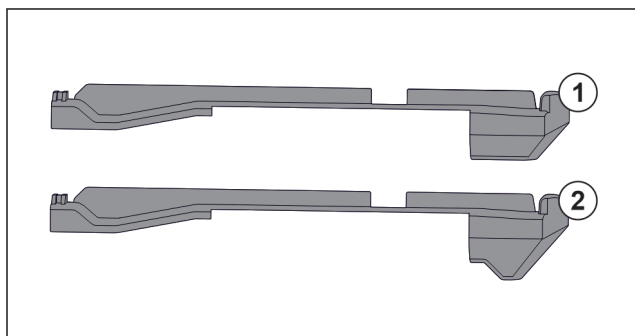


Fig. 18 Comparing attachments

There are two different attachments in the appliance. The attachment above the lowest drawer Fig. 18 (2) has a three-cornered edge. All other attachments Fig. 18 (1) have a straight edge.

- ▶ Fit attachment Fig. 18 (2) with the three-cornered edge above the lowest drawer.
- ▶ Fit attachment Fig. 18 (1) with straight edge in all other positions.

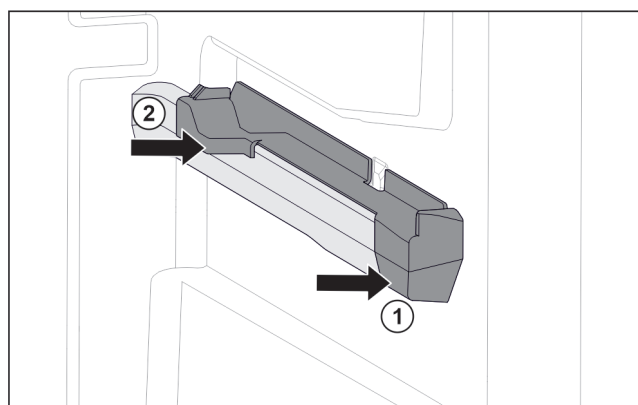


Fig. 19 Attachment on the right moulded rib

- ▶ Position attachment on moulded rib at the front. Fig. 19 (1)
- ▶ Press on attachment at the back. Fig. 19 (2)

## 8.3 Defrosting the appliance



### WARNING

Improper defrosting of the appliance!  
Injuries and damage.

- ▶ Do not use mechanical equipment or other methods to speed up the defrosting process other than those recommended by the manufacturer.
- ▶ Do not use electrical heating or steam-cleaning appliances, naked flames or defroster sprays to defrost.
- ▶ Do not use sharp objects to remove ice.

Defrosting is performed automatically. The water from the thawing process drains through the outlet and evaporates.

Water drops or a thin layer of frost or ice can form on the back wall; this is a completely normal part of the appliance's function. This must not be removed.

- ▶ Clean the drain opening regularly (see 8.4 Cleaning the appliance).

## 8.4 Cleaning the appliance

### 8.4.1 Ready



### WARNING

Danger of electric shock!

- ▶ Remove the refrigerator connector or interrupt the power supply.



### WARNING

Risk of fire

- ▶ Do not damage the refrigeration circuit.

- ▶ Empty the appliance.
- ▶ Remove mains connector.

-or-

- ▶ Activate CleaningMode. (see CleaningMode)

### 8.4.2 Cleaning the interior

#### NOTICE

Improper cleaning!

Damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Only use soft cleaning cloths and ph-neutral all-purpose cleaners.
- ▶ Do not use abrasive sponges or steel wool which may cause scratches.
- ▶ Do not use any sharp or abrasive cleaning agents, nor any that contain sand, chloride or acid.

- ▶ Plastic surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Metal surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Drain outlet Fig. 1 (3): remove any deposits with a thin item such as a cotton bud.

### 8.4.3 Clean the components

#### NOTICE

Improper cleaning!

Damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Only use soft cleaning cloths and ph-neutral all-purpose cleaners.
- ▶ Do not use abrasive sponges or steel wool which may cause scratches.
- ▶ Do not use any sharp or abrasive cleaning agents, nor any that contain sand, chloride or acid.

**Clean with a soft, clean cloth, lukewarm water and some detergent:**

- Drawer
- ▶ To disassemble components: see the relevant section.
- ▶ Clean the components.

### 8.4.4 After cleaning

- ▶ Wipe the appliance and the components dry.
- ▶ Connect and switch on the appliance.  
The temperature is cold enough:
- ▶ Place the food inside.
- ▶ Repeat cleaning regularly.

In the unlikely event that a fault occurs during operation, please check whether it is due to an operating error. If so, you will be charged for the callout and repair costs even if it falls within the warranty period.

You can fix the following faults yourself.

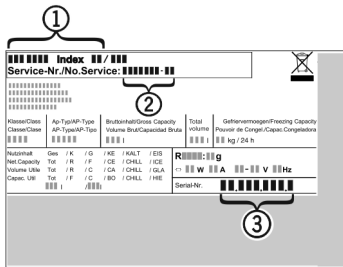

## 10 Shutting down

- ▶ Empty the appliance.
- ▶ Turn off the appliance (see 6.4 Settings).
- ▶ Remove mains connector.
- ▶ Remove appliance connector if required: Remove and move from left to right at the same time.
- ▶ Clean the appliance (see 8.4 Cleaning the appliance).
- ▶ Leave the door open to avoid bad smells building up.

## 11 Disposal

### 11.1 Preparing appliance for disposal



Liebherr uses batteries in some of its appliances. In the EU, for environmental reasons, legislation obliges the end user to remove these batteries before disposing of old appliances. If your appliance contains batteries, a corresponding notice is attached.

**Lamps** If you can remove the lamps yourself without destroying them, also remove these before disposal.

- ▶ Take the appliance out of operation.
- ▶ Appliances with batteries: remove the batteries. For description, see **Maintenance** chapter.
- ▶ If possible: remove lamps without destroying them.

### 11.2 Disposing of the appliance in an environmentally friendly manner



The appliance still contains valuable materials and must be disposed of separately from unsorted municipal waste.



Dispose of batteries separately from the old appliance. To do this, you can return the batteries free of charge to retailers as well as recycling centres and collection centres for recyclable materials.

Lamps

Dispose of removed lamps via the respective collection systems.

For Germany:

You can dispose of the appliance free of charge via the class 1 collection containers at the local recycling and recyclable material collection centres. When purchasing a new fridge/freezer, if the sales area > 400 m<sup>2</sup>, retailers will also take back the old appliance free of charge.

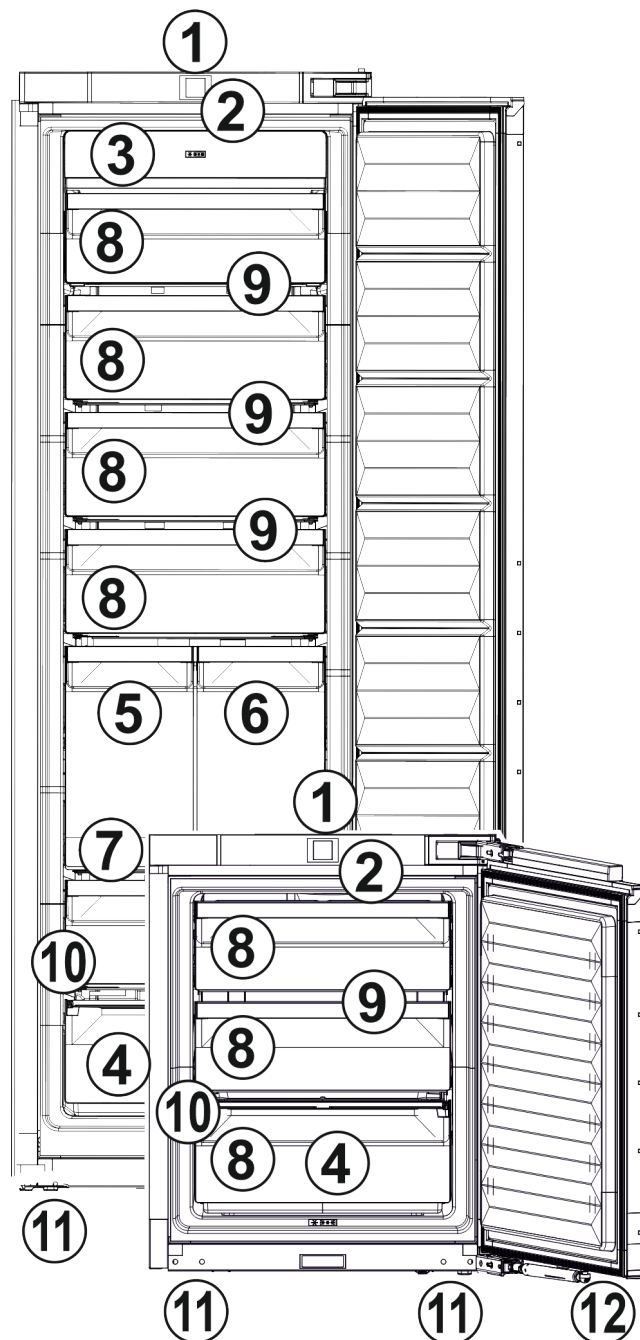

## 1.4 Appliance range of use

### Intended use

The appliance is only suitable for cooling food products in a domestic or household-like environment. This includes, for example, use:

- in staff kitchens, bed and breakfast establishments,
- by guests in country houses, hotels, motels and other accommodation,
- for catering and similar services in the wholesale trade.

All other types of use are not permitted.

### Foreseeable misuse

The following applications are expressly forbidden:

- Storing and refrigerating medicines, blood plasma, laboratory preparations or similar substances and products based on the Medical Device Directive 2007/47/EC
- Use in areas at risk of explosions

Misusing the appliance may lead to damage to the goods stored or they may spoil.

### Climate classifications

## 2 General safety instructions

Please keep these operating instructions in a safe place so you can refer back to them at any time.

If you pass the appliance on, please hand these operating instructions to the next user.

Read these operating instructions carefully before use to ensure safe and correct use of the appliance. Follow the instructions, safety instructions and warning messages included at all times. They are important for ensuring you can operate and install the appliance safely and without any problems.

### **Danger for the user:**

- This device can be used by children and people with impaired physical, sensory or mental abilities or with a lack of experience and knowledge provided that they are supervised or have received instruction in the safe use of this device, and about the resulting hazards. Children must not play with this appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance work must not be carried out by children without adult supervision. Children aged between 3 and 8 are allowed to load and unload the appliance. Children below the age of 3 must be kept away from the appliance unless they are under continuous adult supervision.
- The socket must be easily accessible so that the appliance can be disconnected quickly from the electricity in an emergency. It must not be located in the area behind the appliance.
- When disconnecting the appliance from the supply, always take hold of the plug. Do not pull the cable.
- In the event of a fault pull out the mains plug or deactivate the fuse.
- Do not damage the mains power cable. Do not operate the appliance with a defective mains power cable.
- Only customer service or other specially trained staff may repair or perform other operations on the appliance.
- Only install, connect and dispose of the appliance according to the instructions.
- Only use the appliance when it is installed.
- The manufacturer is not liable for damage caused by a faulty fixed water connection.\*

### **Fire hazard:**

- The coolant used (information on the model plate) is ecofriendly but also flammable. Any leaking coolant may ignite.

- Do not damage the refrigerant circuit pipes.
- Do not handle ignition sources inside the appliance.
- Do not use electrical appliances inside the appliance (e.g. steam cleaners, heaters, ice cream makers, etc.).
- If the refrigerant leaks: remove any naked flames or ignition sources from the vicinity of the leakage point. Properly air the room. Inform customer services.

- All marketing leaflets are removed from the drawers.

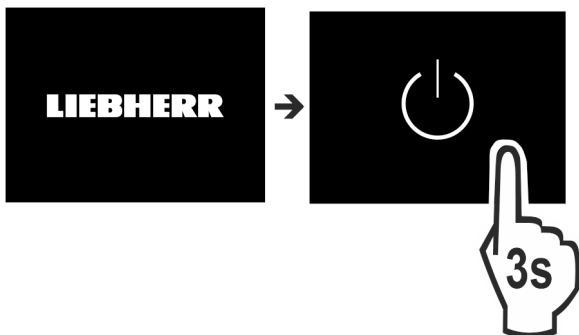

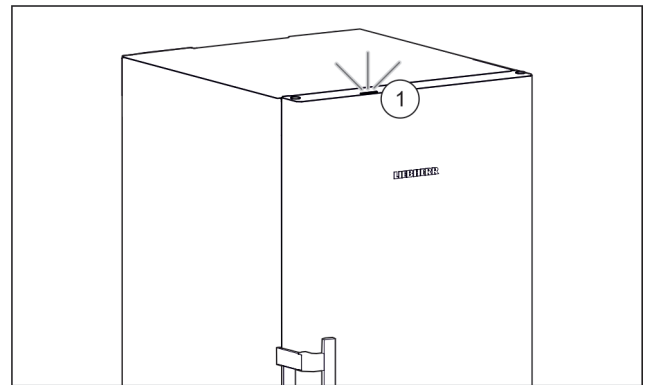

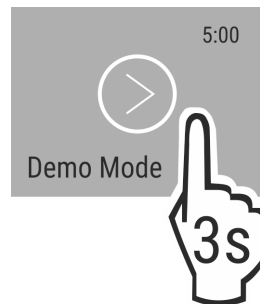

## 4 Foods management

### 4.1 Storing food



#### WARNING

Risk of fire

- ▶ Do not use any electrical appliances in the food area of the appliance unless recommended by the manufacturer.

#### Note

The energy consumption increases and the cooling power goes down if ventilation is not sufficient.

- ▶ Always keep air slots clear.

When storing food, always observe the following:

- Air vents on the inside rear wall are unobstructed.
- Air vents on the fan are unobstructed.
- Food is in sealed packaging.
- Raw meat and fish are in clean, sealed containers to prevent them coming into contact with or dripping onto other foods.
- Foods are not stored too closely together, as the air needs to circulate.

#### Note

Failure to follow these guidelines can lead to food perishing.

#### 4.1.1 Freezer compartment

This provides a dry, frosty storage climate at -18 °C. A frosty climate is great for storing frozen food and frozen goods for several months, making ice cubes and freezing fresh food.

#### Freezing food

You can freeze as many kilograms of fresh food within 24 hours as indicated on the nameplate (see 9.5 Model plate) under "freezing capacity ... kg/24h".

So that the food is rapidly frozen through to the core, keep to the following quantities per pack:

- Fruit, vegetables up to 1 kg
- Meat up to 2.5 kg

Before freezing goods, please make sure of the following:

- SuperFrost is activated (see 6.3 Functions) when the amount of food to freeze exceeds approx. 2 kg.
- With a small amount of frozen goods: SuperFrost is activated approx. 6 hours prior.
- With the maximum amount of frozen goods: SuperFrost is activated approx. 24 hours prior.

#### Arrange your food as follows:



#### CAUTION

Risk of injury from glass fragments!

Drink bottles and cans may explode if frozen. This applies particularly to carbonated drinks.

- ▶ Only freeze drink bottles and cans when using the *bottle timer* function.

#### For appliances smaller than 122 cm:

With a small amount of frozen goods:

- ▶ Distribute packaged groceries across all drawers.
- ▶ If possible, place groceries at the back of the drawer near the rear wall.

With a maximum amount of frozen goods:

- ▶ Distribute packaged groceries across all drawers.
- ▶ If possible, place groceries at the back of the drawer near the rear wall.

#### For appliances larger than or exactly 122 cm:

With a small amount of frozen goods:

- ▶ Distribute packaged groceries across all drawers, but do not place any groceries in the top drawer.
- With a maximum amount of frozen goods:
- ▶ Distribute packaged groceries across all drawers.
  - ▶ If possible, place groceries at the back of the drawer near the rear wall.

#### For all appliances:

With a maximum amount of frozen goods:

- ▶ Once SuperFrost deactivates automatically, place food into the drawer.

#### Defrost the food

- In the fridge
- In the microwave
- In the stove/oven
- At room temperature



#### WARNING

Risk of food poisoning!

- ▶ Do not re-freeze thawed food.

- ▶ Only take out the food you need at the time.
- ▶ Cook defrosted food as soon as possible.

#### Freezer tray

Use the freezer tray for berries, herbs, vegetables and other small goods without them freezing together in the process. The food keeps its shape and is easier to separate into portions later on.

You can also store the freezer packs in the freezer tray to save space.

- ▶ Spread food, unsealed, at a good distance apart, over the whole surface of the freezer tray.

## 4.2 Storage times

Refer to the specified storage times as a guide.

In the case of foods with a minimum shelf life, the date indicated on the packaging still applies.

Recommended storage period for various types of food		
Ice cream	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Sausages, ham	at -18 °C	2 to 3 months
Bread, baked goods	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Game, pork	at -18 °C	6 to 9 months
Fatty fish	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Lean fish	at -18 °C	6 to 8 months
Cheese	at -18 °C	2 to 6 months
Poultry, beef	at -18 °C	6 to 12 months
Vegetables, fruit	at -18 °C	6 to 12 months

## 5 Saving energy

- Pay attention to good ventilation. Do not cover ventilation holes or grids.
- Always keep the fan air slits clear.
- Do not install the appliance in direct sunlight, next to an oven, radiator or similar.
- Energy consumption depends on the installation conditions, e.g. the ambient temperature (see 1.4 Appliance range of use). A warmer ambient temperature can increase the energy consumption.

# Controls

- Open the appliance for as short a time as possible.
- The lower the temperature is set the higher the energy consumption.
- Keep all food properly packed and covered. This prevents frost from forming.
- Inserting warm food: allow to cool down to room temperature first.

## 6 Controls

### 6.1 Controls and displays

The display gives you a quick overview of the temperature setting and the status of functions and settings. Select or adjust functions by activating/deactivating or selecting a value.

#### 6.1.1 Status display

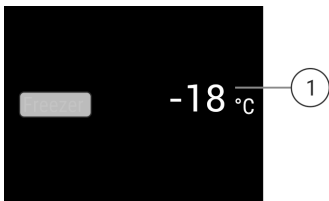






(1) Temperature display

## \* SuperFrost

This function selects the lowest freezing temperature. This gives you colder storage temperatures.

Use:

- For storing more than 2 kg fresh food every day.
- Freezing fresh food quickly to the core.
- Increasing the cold reserves in the stored goods before defrosting the appliance.

### Activating/deactivating the function

With a small amount to freeze:

- ▶ Activate 6 hours before use.
- With a maximum amount to freeze:

## PartyMode

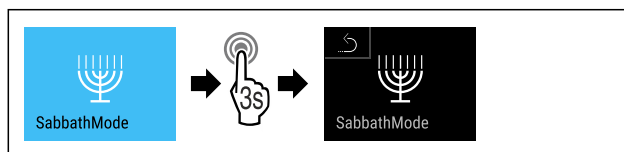

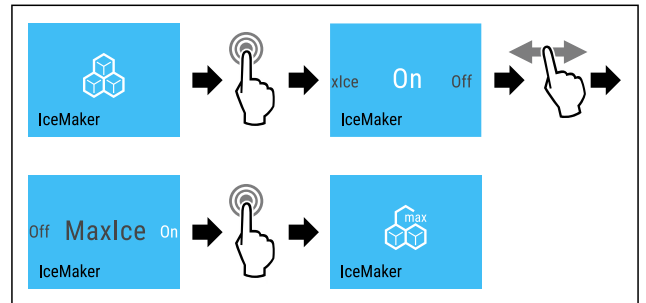

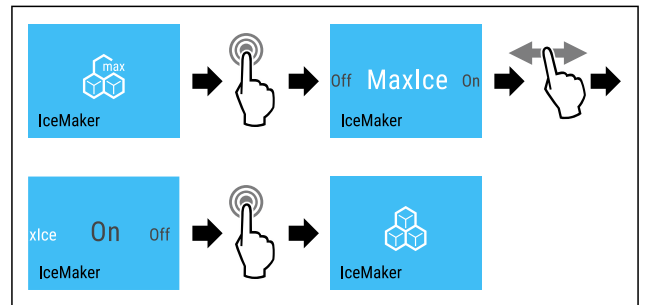

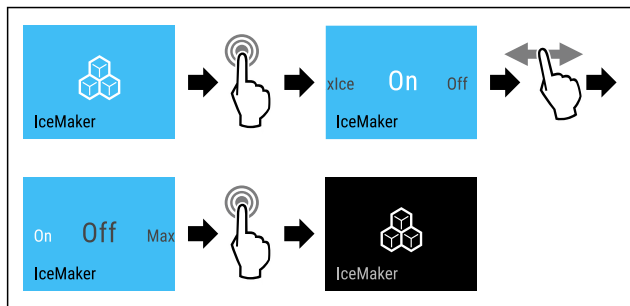


Fig. 20 Example illustration of the active IceMaker function

Reminders are given out acoustically by a beep and visually by a symbol in the display. The signal gets louder until the alert stops.

This function resets all settings to the factory settings. All settings that you have made thus far will be reset to their original values.

## 6.4 Fault messages

Fault messages appear in the display. There are two categories of fault message:

Category	Meaning
Message	Reminder of general procedures. You can carry out these procedures to eliminate the message.
Warning	Appears when there are malfunctions. A signal sounds in addition to the display. The signal becomes louder until you acknowledge by tapping the display. You can eliminate simple defects yourself. For more serious defects, you must contact customer service.

### 6.4.1 Warnings



#### Close the door

This message appears if the door is open for too long.

You can set how long it takes for this message to appear .

- ▶ Stop alarm: Confirm the message.

-or-

- ▶ Close the door.



#### Power cut

This message appears if the freezer temperature increased due to a power cut. After the power is restored, the appliance continues to work at the set temperature.

- ▶ Stop alarm: Confirm the message.
- ▷ Temperature alert appears (see Temperature alarm) .



#### Temperature alarm

This message appears if the temperature does not match the set temperature.

Variations in temperature could be because:

- Hot, fresh food was inserted.
- Too much warm room air flowed in when rearranging and removing food.
- The power was cut off for a while.
- The appliance is faulty.

When the fault is eliminated the appliance continues to work at the set temperature.

- ▶ Confirm the display.
- ▷ The highest temperature is shown.
- ▶ Confirm display again.

- ▷ The status display is displayed.
- ▷ The current temperature is shown.



## Error

This message appears if there is a fault with the appliance. An appliance component indicates a fault.

- ▶ Open the door.
- ▶ Note down the fault code.
- ▶ Confirm the message.
- ▷ The signal tone stops.
- ▷ The status display appears.
- ▶ Close the door.
- ▶ Contact customer service. (see 9.4 Customer Services)

### 6.4.2 Message



#### Insert IceMaker drawer\*

This message appears if the IceMaker drawer is open.

- ▶ Push in the IceMaker drawer.
- ▷ The message disappears.
- ▷ The IceMaker produces ice cubes.

### 6.4.3 DemoMode

If "D" appears on the display, demo mode is on. This option is designed for retailers, as it turns off all the cooling functions.

#### Stopping DemoMode

If you see the following running in the display:

- ▶ Confirm the display within the countdown.
- ▷ DemoMode is off.
- If the timer is not running:
  - ▶ Unplug the appliance.
  - ▶ Plug the appliance in again.
- ▷ DemoMode is off.

## 7 Features

### 7.1 Drawers

You can remove the drawers for cleaning.

You can remove the drawers to use VarioSpace.

The way to remove/insert the drawers varies depending on the pull-out system. Your appliance can contain various pull-out systems.

#### Note

The energy consumption increases and the cooling power goes down if ventilation is not sufficient.

- ▶ Leave the bottom drawer in the appliance!
- ▶ Always leave the fan air vents clear on the back wall!

#### 7.1.1 Drawer on appliance base or glass shelf

The drawer runs directly on the appliance base or on a glass shelf. There are no rails.

When you remove the drawers, you can use the glass shelves below them as storage shelves.\*

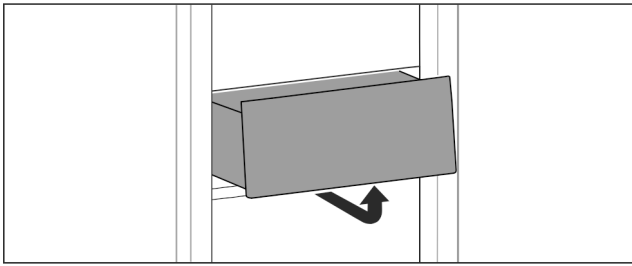

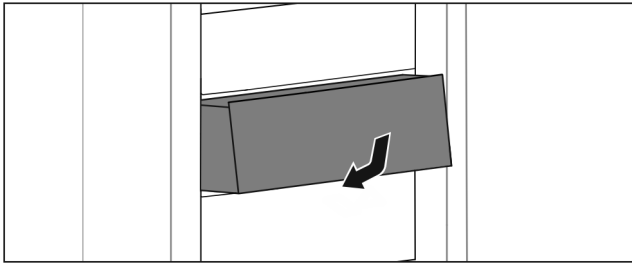

## 7.1.2 Drawer on telescopic rails\*

The drawer runs on extendible rails (telescopic rails). There are fully extendible telescopic rails and telescopic rails with partial pull-out. Drawers which are fully extendible can be pulled out fully from the appliance. Drawers with partial pull-out cannot be removed fully from the appliance. The system in your appliance depends on the type of appliance.

### Drawer on glass shelf

The drawer guided on a glass shelf is a partial pull-out.

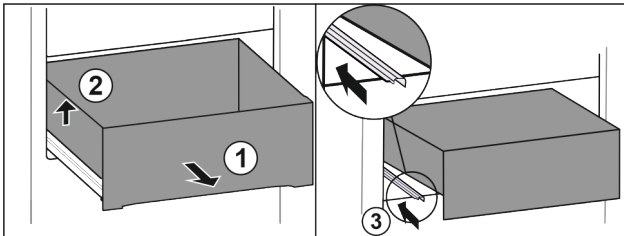

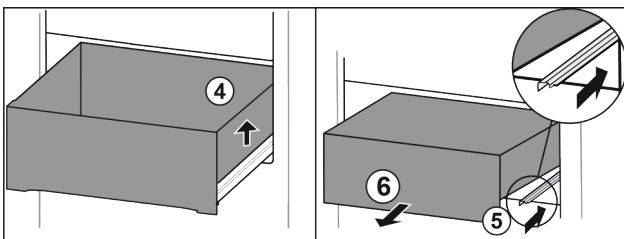

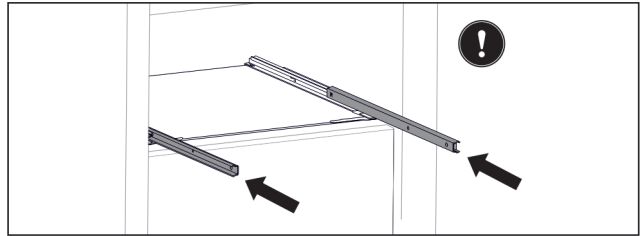

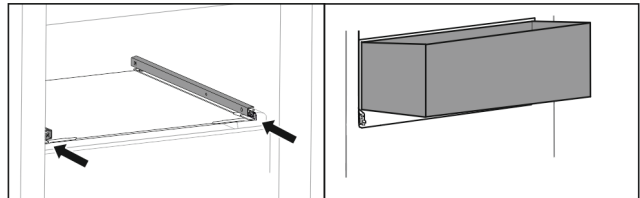

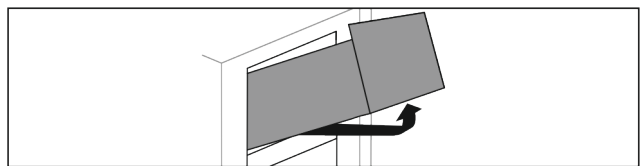

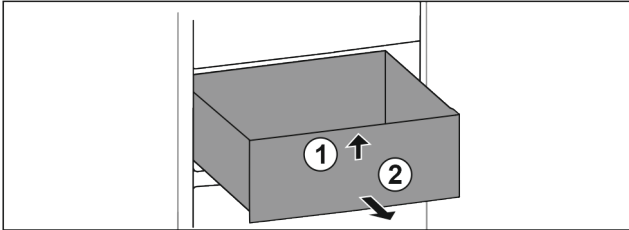

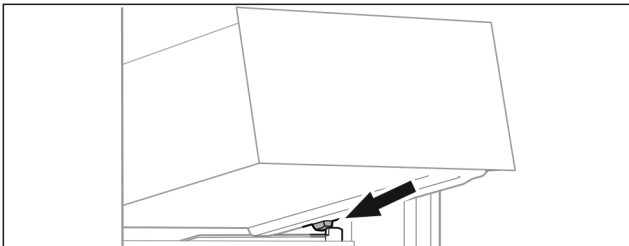

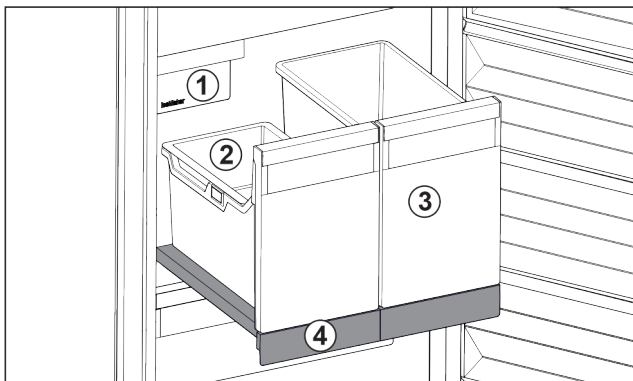


Fig. 32 Pull-out board with IceTower

There are two high (IceTower) containers on the pull-out board. Ice cubes from the IceMaker are collected and stored in the Fig. 32 (2) container. The container Fig. 32 (3) is suitable for storing tall foodstuffs or beverages such as pizzas or alcoholic drinks.

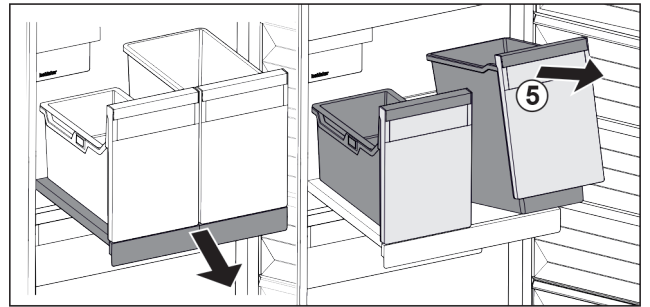

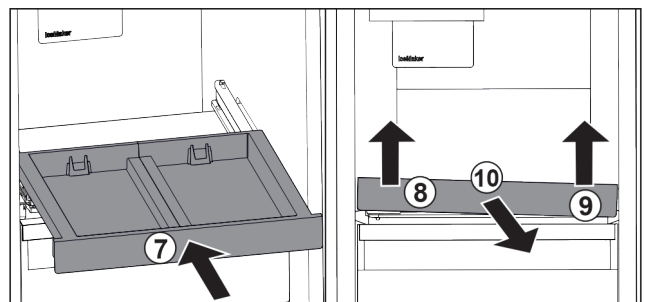

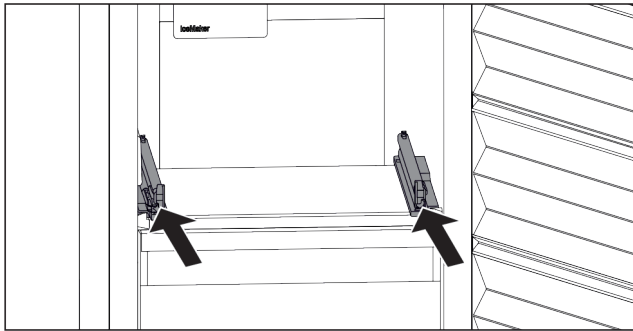

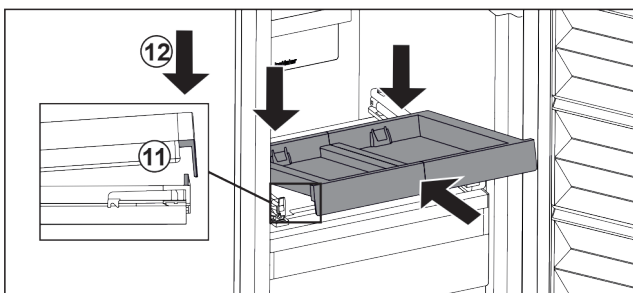

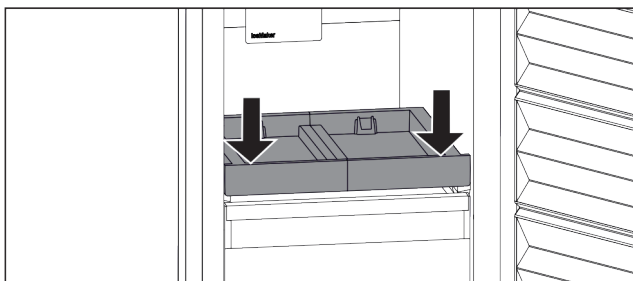

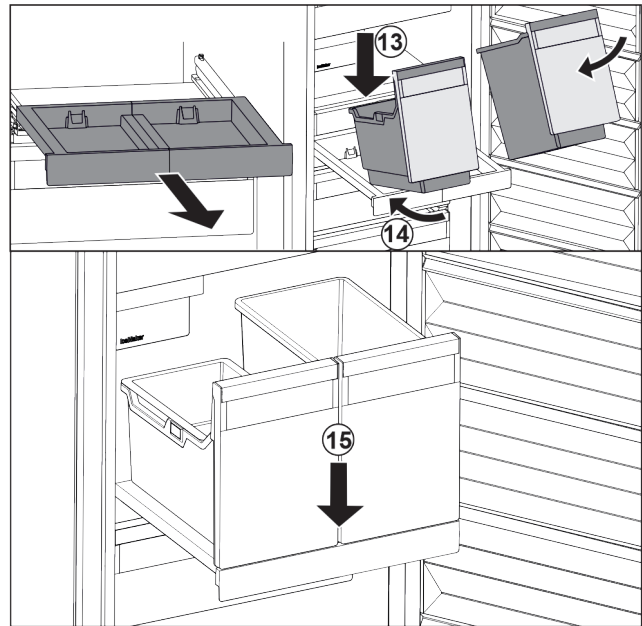

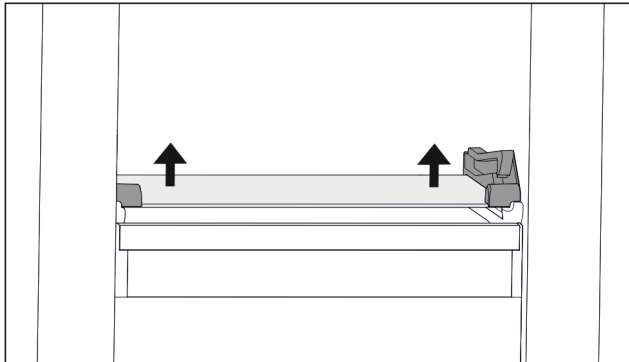


Fig. 41 Tilting drawer glass shelf

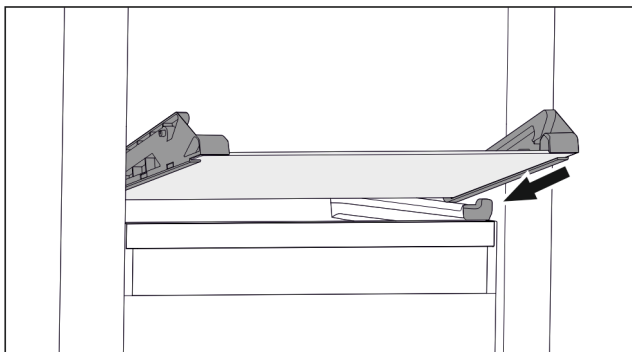


Fig. 42 Tilting drawer glass shelf

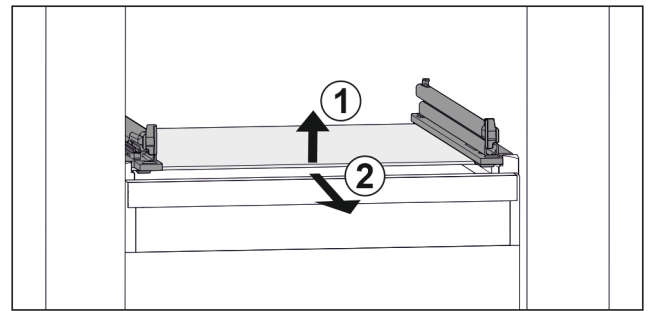


Fig. 43 Example illustration of glass shelf

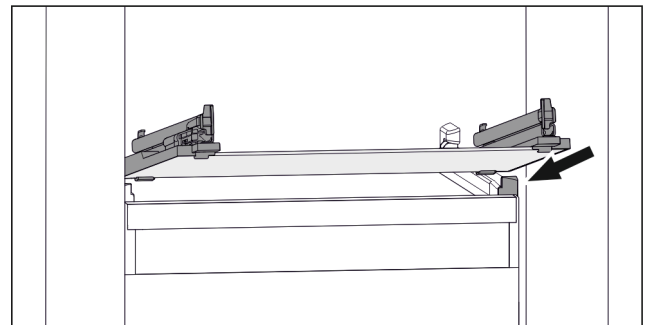


Fig. 44 Example illustration of glass shelf

## 7.4 IceMaker\*

The IceMaker will produce ice cubes for household use only.

Ensure that the following conditions are met:

- IceMaker is cleaned (see 8 Maintenance) .
- IceMaker drawer is cleaned.
- IceMaker drawer is fully inserted.

### 7.4.1 Producing ice cubes

The volume depends on the freezing temperature. The colder the temperature, the more ice cubes the system can produce in a certain time period.

After the IceMaker is turned on for the first time, it can take up to 24 hours for the first ice cubes to be made.

- ▶ Activate the IceMaker function (see 6.2 Control concept) .
- ▶ To make a high number of ice cubes: Activate the MaxIce function (see 6.2 Control concept) .
- ▶ Distribute the ice cubes evenly in the drawer to increase the capacity.
- ▶ Closing the drawer: IceMaker starts making ice cubes again automatically.

### Note

When a certain level is reached in the IceMaker drawer, it stops producing ice cubes. The IceMaker does not fill the drawer all the way to the top.



## 7.5 VarioSpace

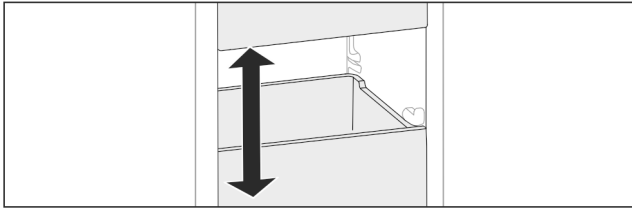

You can remove drawers and glass panels from your appliance. This provides more room for large food items such as poultry, joints of meat, large game, and tall baked products. You can then freeze these items whole for later preparation.

- ▶ Note the weight limits on the drawers and glass panels (see 9.1 Technical specifications).

## 7.6 Accessories

### 7.6.1 Freezer pack

Freezer packs prevent the temperature rising too quickly should there be a power cut.

The freezer packs are in the drawer.

You can store the freezer packs in the freezer tray.

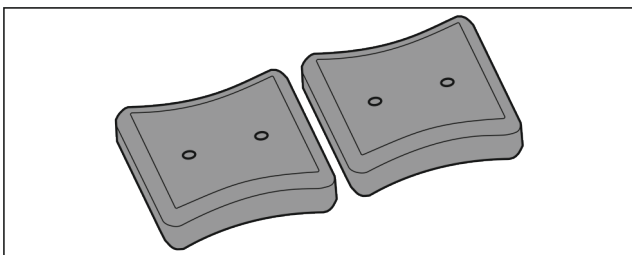

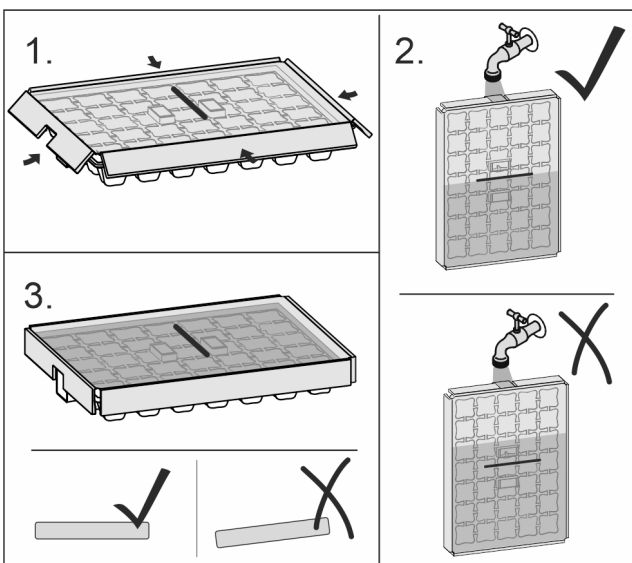

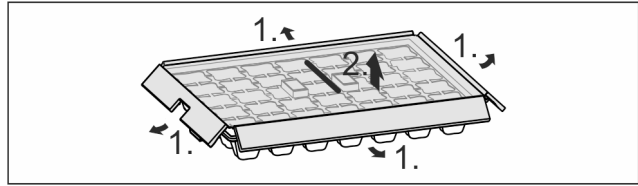

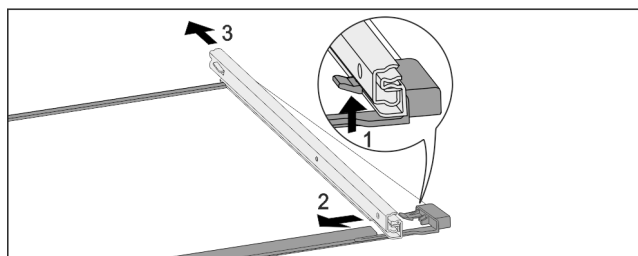


Fig. 49 Glass shelf with rails

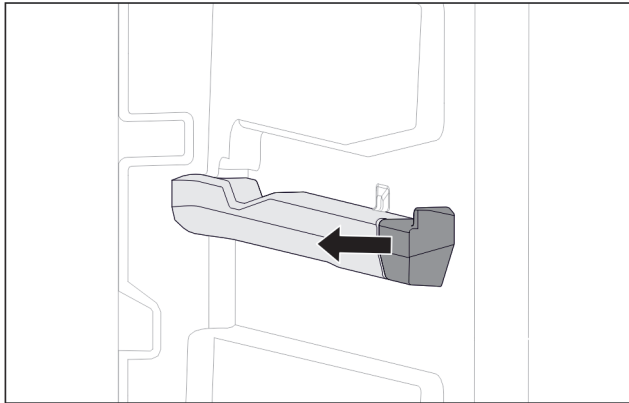


Fig. 50 Attachment on the right moulded rib

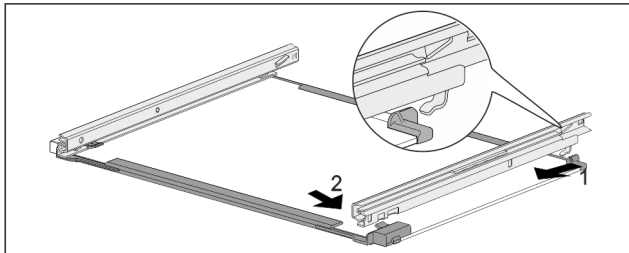


Fig. 51 Glass shelf with rails

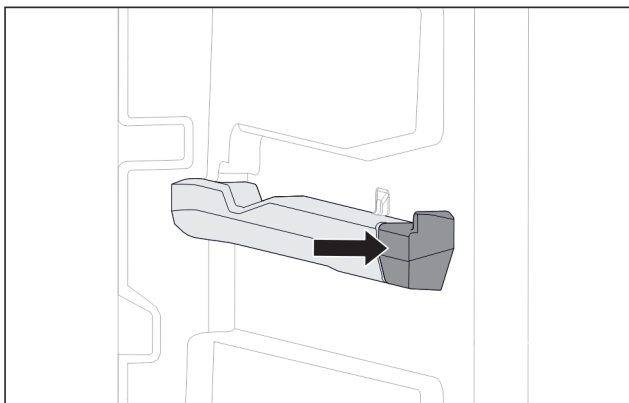


Fig. 52 Attachment on the right moulded rib

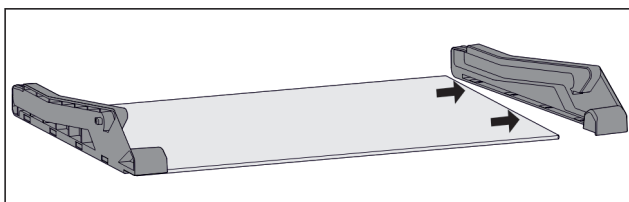


Fig. 53 Glass shelf with side parts

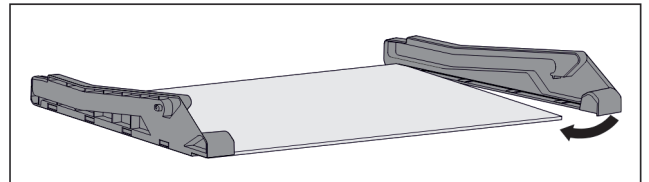


Fig. 54 Glass shelf with side parts

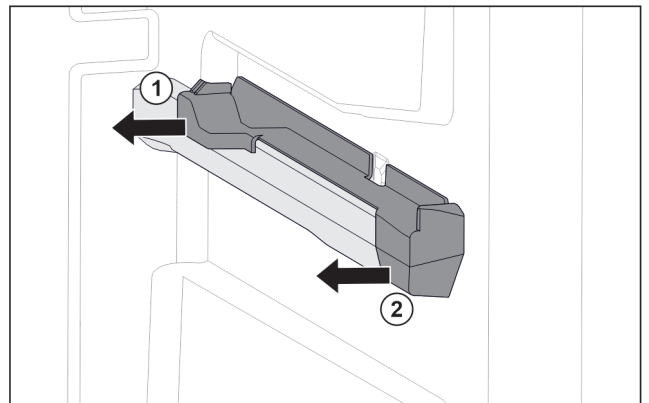


Fig. 55 Attachment on the right moulded rib

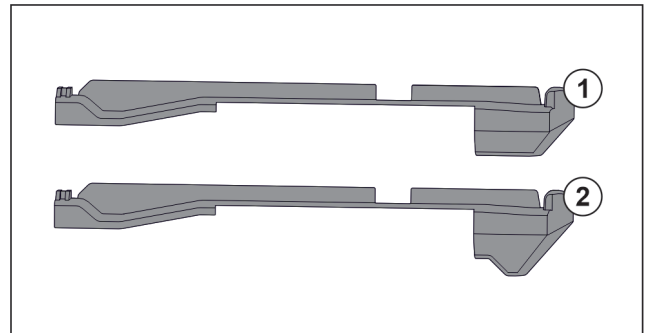


Fig. 56 Comparing attachments

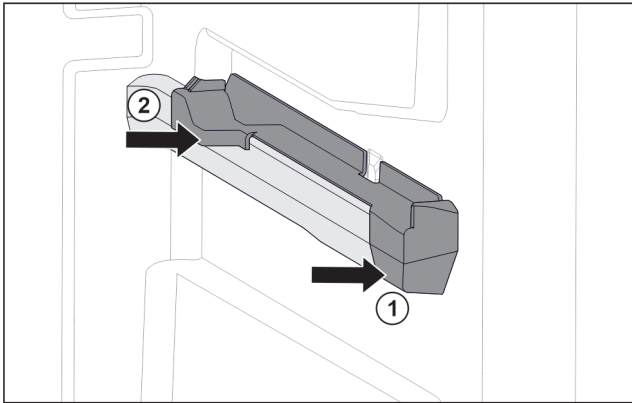


Fig. 57 Attachment on the right moulded rib

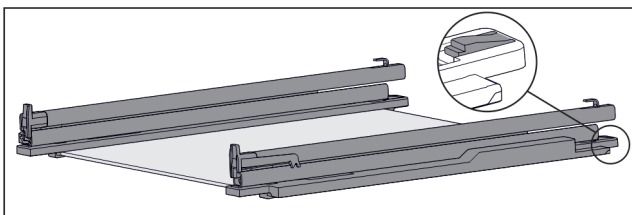


Fig. 58 Glass shelf with rails and retaining parts

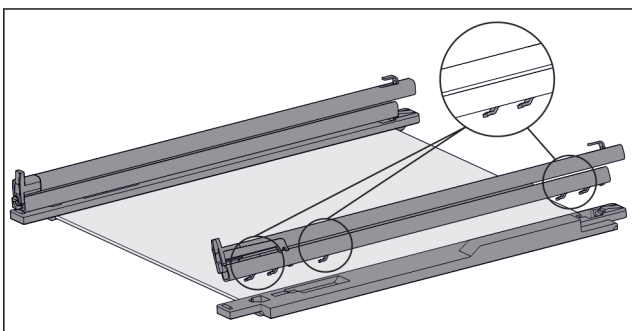


Fig. 59 Glass shelf with rails and retaining parts

- ▶ Remove rail from retaining part.

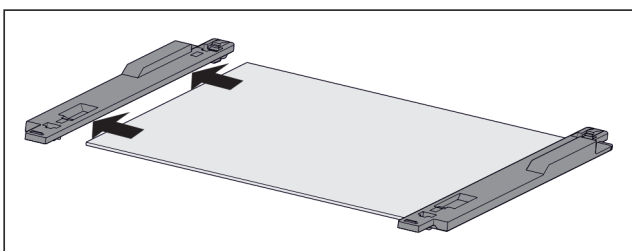


Fig. 60 Glass shelf with retaining part

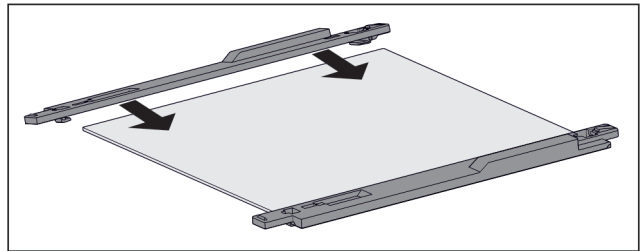


Fig. 61 Glass shelf with retaining part

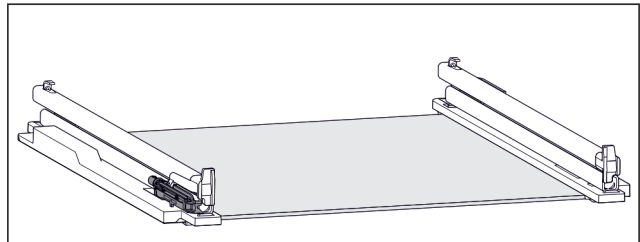


Fig. 62 Damping mechanism

The damping mechanism is attached to the left rail. (see Fig. 318) There is no damping mechanism attached to the right rail.

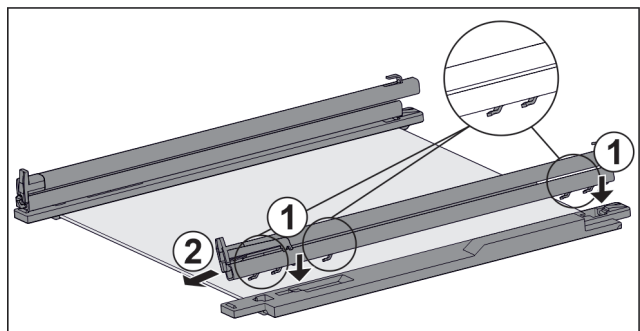


Fig. 63 Glass shelf with rails and retaining parts

## 8.2 Defrosting the appliance

### 8.2.1 Defrosting with NoFrost

Defrosting is performed automatically with the NoFrost system. The moisture is deposited on the evaporator, is periodically defrosted and evaporates.

The appliance does not need to be defrosted.

## 8.3 Cleaning the appliance

### 8.3.1 Ready



#### WARNING

Danger of electric shock!

- ▶ Remove the refrigerator connector or interrupt the power supply.



#### WARNING

Risk of fire

- ▶ Do not damage the refrigeration circuit.

- ▶ Empty the appliance.
- ▶ Remove mains connector.

### 8.3.2 Cleaning the interior

#### NOTICE

Improper cleaning!

Damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Only use soft cleaning cloths and ph-neutral all-purpose cleaners.
- ▶ Do not use abrasive sponges or steel wool which may cause scratches.
- ▶ Do not use any sharp or abrasive cleaning agents, nor any that contain sand, chloride or acid.

- ▶ Plastic surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Metal surfaces: clean by hand with a soft clean cloth, lukewarm water and a little detergent.

### 8.3.3 Clean the components

#### NOTICE

Improper cleaning!

Damage to the appliance.

- ▶ Only use soft cleaning cloths and ph-neutral all-purpose cleaners.
- ▶ Do not use abrasive sponges or steel wool which may cause scratches.
- ▶ Do not use any sharp or abrasive cleaning agents, nor any that contain sand, chloride or acid.

**Clean with a soft, clean cloth, lukewarm water and some detergent:**

- IceTower pull-out board\*
- Drawer  
Please note: Do not remove the magnet on the drawer. The magnet ensures the functionality of the IceMaker.\*
- Freezer tray

**Clean with a damp cloth:\***

- Retractable rails  
Please note: The grease in the tracks is used for lubrication and must not be removed!

**Wash in the dishwasher up to 60 °C:**

- Ice cube tray\*
- Ice cube scoop\*
- ▶ To disassemble components: see the relevant section.
- ▶ Clean the components.

### 8.3.4 Cleaning the IceMaker\*

There are various options for cleaning the IceMaker.

Cleaning is required in the following cases:

- Initial operation
- If out of use for more than 5 days.\*

Ensure that the following conditions are met:

- IceMaker drawer is emptied.
- IceMaker drawer is in place.
- The IceMaker is activated. (see 6.2 Control concept)

#### First use or after a long period of non-use

Clean the IceMaker with the TubeClean function.

- ▶ Place a 1.5 l empty container (max. height 10 cm) into the drawer under the IceMaker.
- ▶ Activate the TubeClean function. (see 6.2 Control concept)
- ▷ The rinse process is prepared (max. 60 min.): Symbol flashes.
- ▷ Water pipes are rinsed: Symbol flashes.
- ▷ Rinsing process is complete: Function turns off automatically.
- ▶ Remove the IceMaker drawer and remove the container.
- ▶ Clean the IceMaker drawer with warm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Push the IceMaker drawer in.
- ▷ The system starts making ice cubes automatically.
- ▶ Dispose of any ice cubes that were made 24 hours after the first ice cubes.

#### If cleaning is required

Clean the IceMaker by hand.

- ▶ Remove the IceMaker drawer and clean with warm water and a little detergent.
- ▶ Push the IceMaker drawer in.
- ▷ The system starts making ice cubes automatically.

### 8.3.5 After cleaning

- ▶ Wipe the appliance and the components dry.
- ▶ Connect and switch on the appliance.
- ▶ Activate SuperFrost (see 6.3 Functions) .  
The temperature is cold enough:
- ▶ Place the food inside.
- ▶ Repeat cleaning regularly.

## 9.2 Operating noises

The appliance makes different noises when it is on.

- At **higher temperatures** the appliance uses less energy but works for longer. It is **quieter**.
- At **lower temperatures** the food is cooled faster. It is **louder**.

Examples:

- Functions on (see 6.3 Functions)
- Fan running
- Food recently added
- High ambient temperature
- Door open for a while

Your appliance is designed and built to ensure it works reliably and has a long service life. In the unlikely event that a fault occurs during operation, please check whether it is due to an operating error. If so, you will be charged for the

callout and repair costs even if it falls within the warranty period.

You can fix the following faults yourself.

## 9.3.1 Appliance function

Defect	Cause	Remedy
<b>The appliance is not working.</b>	→ The appliance is not switched on.	▶ Switch the appliance on.
	→ The power plug is not properly plugged into the socket.	▶ Check the power plug.
	→ There is something wrong with the power outlet fuse.	▶ Check the fuse.
	→ Power cut	▶ Keep the appliance closed. ▶ Protecting food: Lay freezer packs on top of the food or use another freezer if the power is off for a prolonged period. ▶ Do not re-freeze defrosted food,
	→ The appliance plug does not fit the appliance properly.	▶ Check the appliance plug.
<b>Temperature is not cold enough.</b>	→ The appliance door is not closed properly.	▶ Close the appliance door.
	→ Not enough ventilation.	▶ Keep ventilation grille clear, and clean it.
	→ The ambient temperature is too high.	▶ Solution: (see 1.4 Appliance range of use) .
	→ The appliance was opened too many times or for too long.	▶ Wait to see if the required temperature corrects itself. If not, contact Customer Service (see 9.4 Customer Services) .
	→ Too much fresh food was placed inside without SuperFrost.	▶ Solution: (see SuperFrost)
	→ The temperature is set incorrectly.	▶ Turn down the temperature and check after 24 hours.

## 9.3.2 Features

<b>You cannot activate the IceMaker.*</b>	→ The appliance and therefore the IceMaker are not connected.	▶ Connect the appliance (see the Installation Guide).
<b>The IceMaker is not producing ice cubes.*</b>	→ The IceMaker is not on.	▶ Activate the IceMaker.
	→ The drawer of the IceMakers is not connected properly.	▶ Push the drawer in correctly.
	→ The water connection is not open.	▶ Open the water connection.*
<b>The internal light does not come on.</b>	→ The appliance is not switched on.	▶ Switch the appliance on.
	→ The door was open for longer than 15 minutes.	▶ Interior lighting turns off automatically after approx. 15 min. with the door open.

Defect	Cause	Remedy
	→ The LED interior light is faulty or the lid is damaged.	▶ Contact customer service (see 9.4 Customer Services) .

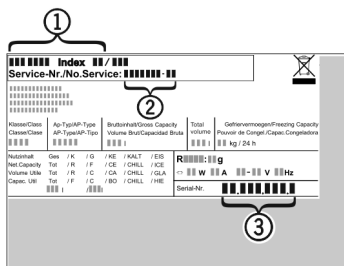

## 10 Shutting down

- ▶ Empty the appliance.
- ▶ Turn off the IceMaker.\*
- ▶ Turn off the appliance .
- ▶ Remove mains connector.
- ▶ Remove appliance connector if required: Remove and move from left to right at the same time.
- ▶ Clean the appliance (see 8.3 Cleaning the appliance) .
- ▶ Leave the door open to avoid bad smells building up.

## 11 Disposal

### 11.1 Preparing appliance for disposal



Liebherr uses batteries in some of its appliances. In the EU, for environmental reasons, legislation obliges the end user to remove these batteries before disposing of old appliances. If your appliance contains batteries, a corresponding notice is attached.

**Lamps** If you can remove the lamps yourself without destroying them, also remove these before disposal.

- ▶ Take the appliance out of operation.
- ▶ Appliances with batteries: remove the batteries. For description, see **Maintenance** chapter.
- ▶ If possible: remove lamps without destroying them.

### 11.2 Disposing of the appliance in an environmentally friendly manner



The appliance still contains valuable materials and must be disposed of separately from unsorted municipal waste.



Dispose of batteries separately from the old appliance. To do this, you can return the batteries free of charge to retailers as well as recycling centres and collection centres for recyclable materials.

**Lamps**

Dispose of removed lamps via the respective collection systems.

For Germany:

You can dispose of the appliance free of charge via the class 1 collection containers at the local recycling and recyclable material collection centres. When purchasing a new fridge/freezer, if the sales area > 400 m<sup>2</sup>, retailers will also take back the old appliance free of charge.

Leaking coolant and oil!

Fire. The coolant contained in the appliance is eco-friendly, but also flammable. The oil contained in the appliance is flammable. Escaping coolant and oil can ignite if the concentration is high enough and in contact with an external heat source.

- ▶ Do not damage the pipelines of the coolant circuit and the compressor.
- 
- ▶ Transport the appliance without damaging it.
  - ▶ Dispose of batteries, lamps and the appliance according to the above specifications.
